

#### Portraits of children

TORONTO - An intimate exhibition, Toronto Children at the Turn of the Century, is on view to April 25 in the appropriate setting of Toronto's oldest surviving brick house - the Grange. The works were commissioned by prominent families of the day and painted by Laura Muntz Lyall. Designed to represent an upper class home of 1835, the Grange is a living museum staffed by attendants in the costume of the period. Concerts, films and lectures recall the cultural life of the city in the 1830's. The Grange is adjacent to the Art.Gallery of Ontario, Dundas Street west of University Avenue, and is open during gallery hours — 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday, 12 noon to 5 p.m. Sundays and holidays, and 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. Wednesdays and Thursdays from September to mid-May.
