

3 accused of 20 break-ins

RICHMOND HILL — Three Richmond Hill juveniles have been arrested in connection with 20 break-ins in the area over the past several months.

The break-ins, which ranged from Newmarket

to Toronto, included the RCMP offices on Jarvis Street, numerous garages throughout the region, and Richmond Hill Judo Club on Centre Street.

The juveniles face 11 charges of break, enter and theft; two of breaking

and entering with intent; four of theft over \$200 and three of theft under \$200.

More juveniles

Three other juveniles, plus three Richmond Hill teenagers were charged with petty trespassing, after they were picked up in an apartment under construction at Yonge Street and Baif Boulevard.

The teenagers charged were: Brian Boyle, 16; and Robert Gray, 17, both of Essex Avenue; and David Crane, 17 of Paliser Crescent.

Marijuana roundups

Richmond Hill and Markham were the sites

for arrests in connection with the possession of marijuana.

In Richmond Hill, Pasquale Valente, 23 of Hall Street and Elizabeth Lynn, 17 of McConvey Drive, were arrested after being stopped in a van in the Lake Wilcox area.

A third person, Susan Westall, 20, of Aurora, was picked up following a

search of her home.

Charged in the Markham roundup were Debra Postill, 18, of Main Street; Patrick Lindsay, 18, of Markham Motel; and Mike Court, 18, of Friar Tuck Road, Markham.

Court was arrested after he called at the home of one of the arrested people, while police were searching it.
