

# Higher water cost questioned

NEWMARKET — A proposed water rate of 62.8 cents per 1,000 gallons for municipalities, but a user rate of 40 cents, is under consideration by York regional council.

The municipalities within the Central York servicing scheme — Richmond Hill, Markham and Vaughan — will get together and attempt to reach agreement on how to raise their portion to offset the rate.

One suggested method is through lot levies, in which the money collected would be put in a trust fund and held by the region.

The region would then bill the municipalities 62.8 cents, with any

shortage taken out of the fund.

Lot levy legal?

However, there is some question whether lot levies are legal where a self-sustaining service such as water is concerned.

The uniform water rate of 62.8 cents was to have begun at the first of this year and continue for five years but has been put over several times now.

Speaking at a region meeting last week, Mayor David Schiller of Richmond Hill said he felt the proposed rate was "far and above that required in the first year or two to make the system self-sustaining."

They weren't prepared to go with 62.8

as the uniform rate, he said.

Engineering Commissioner Bob Hodgson said if they didn't set the rate for the five-year period now, they'd wind up with "62.8 cents plus."

A disadvantage

Aurora Mayor Evelyn Buck said Aurora built a reservoir just before the region was formed, so that it had a self-sustaining water system with an adequate supply for the next 20 years.

"Now we have the cost of water and the administrative costs, which we didn't have before," the mayor said. "It's a disadvantage and we'll resist further attempts to make this disadvantage."

Vaughan's David Fraser said the town was prepared to accept the rates, but not a lot levy. It wasn't reasonable to charge some of the rates over the balance of the region.

He proposed an amendment that would set out the rate only, and leave the local municipalities to raise that amount (62.8) "whatever way they see fit."

The amendment was lost. Richmond Hill's Gordon Rowe said all the region could do was impose a rate equal to one that would pay for the system, with the municipalities agreeing to raise funds "some way or another."

The present water rate in Richmond Hill is based on a three-month period and is \$9 per 9,000 gallons for residences. If over that amount, an

additional 50 cents per 1,000 gallons is charged.

Apartment houses, with 100 units, are charged \$8.10 per apartment.

## Mission weekend planned

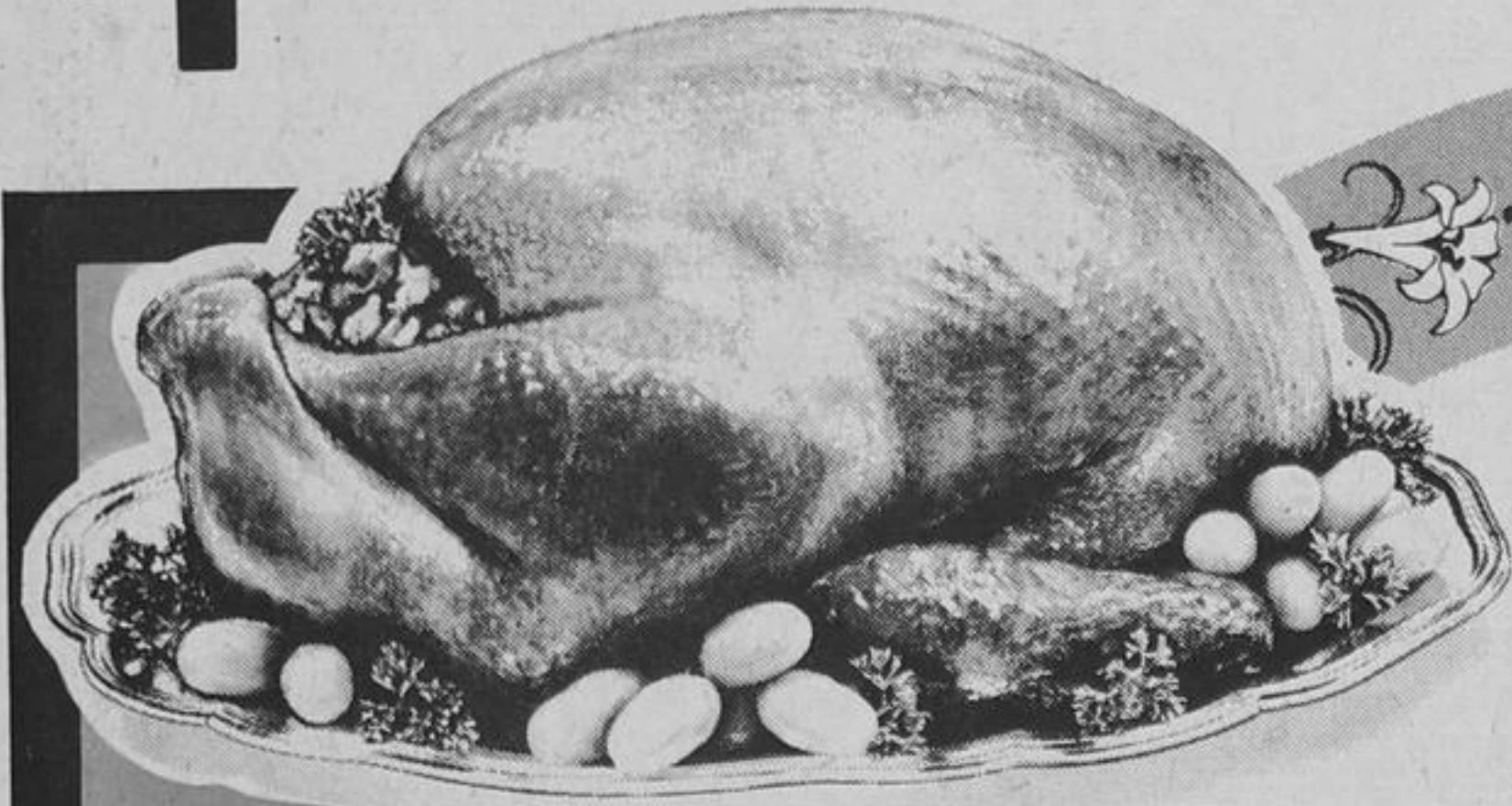
GORMLEY — India and Nicaragua will be in the spotlight when Heise Hill Church holds Missions Weekend May 1 and 2.
