Some timely tips



About four years ago, I took a fellow outdoors writer on a fishing trip. On the way to our favourite spot, we stopped at a restaurant for coffee, but as we were in a hurry, we drank them in the car.

The fellow writer, in the back seat was wondering how he could drink the coffee without spilling it. As usual, I ripped a small hole in the lid and drank mine.

The writer never said a word, but floor dry. when he returned home, he sent his tip to Field and Stream and got \$25.00 for it. I have a few hints of my own, and I would like to pass them on before he makes some more money on me.

Old socks

When trolling for fish, we always move too fast, and I have found two ways to slow your boat down. One is to hang a large pail over each side of the boat. All you need is about four feet of rope, and let it trail along side. The other way is to pull up your motor when ready to troll and tie some old socks over the propeller. It really works!

Mess of rods

rods in your boat? I solved this problem by screwing two pices of inches in length to the transom.

Finally, while we are talking so much about fishing, collect your old coffee grinds and feed them to your dew worms. A tablespoon in each container will give you the cleanest, fattest, and most lively worms to fish with.

When you are fishing with frogs How about that mess of fishing burp them! It sounds funny, I know, but otherwise, there is no way those guys will go down. Place the frog in two-inch plastic pipe about five one hand belly up, gently press on his tummy, and push forward

This will burp them (some of them are quite noisey) without hurting them, and they will go down to the bottom where the big fish are.
