### Do we expect you to give up travelling by car?

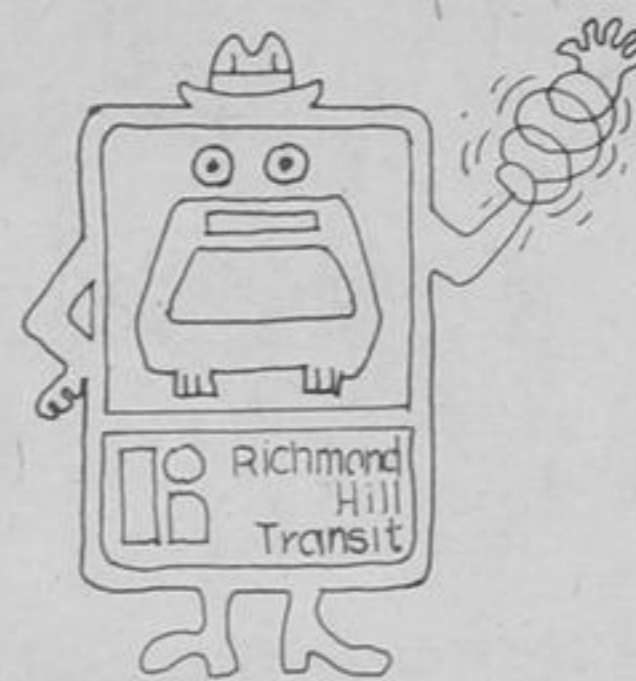

But remember, our Mercedes buses get about 15 miles per gallon with a full load. And you never have to worry about parking.

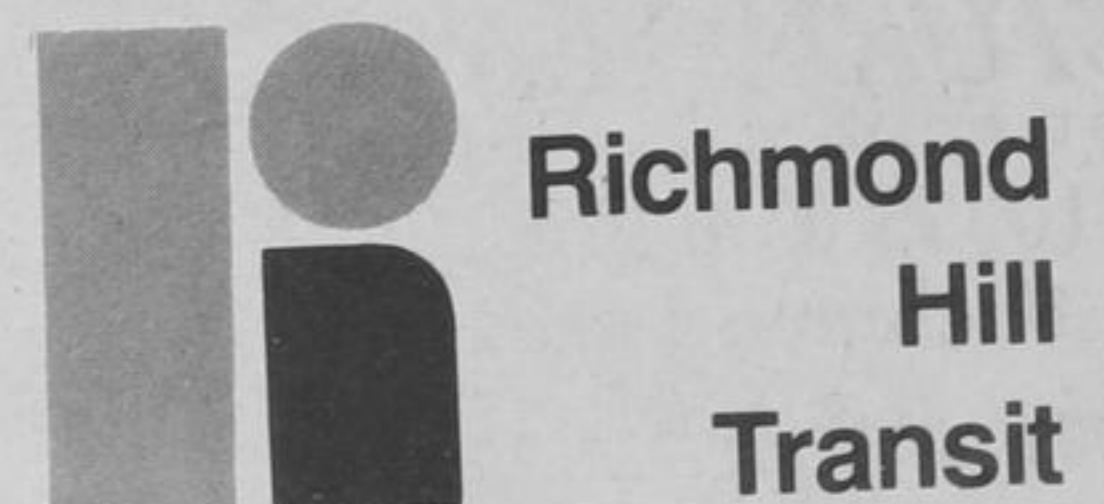
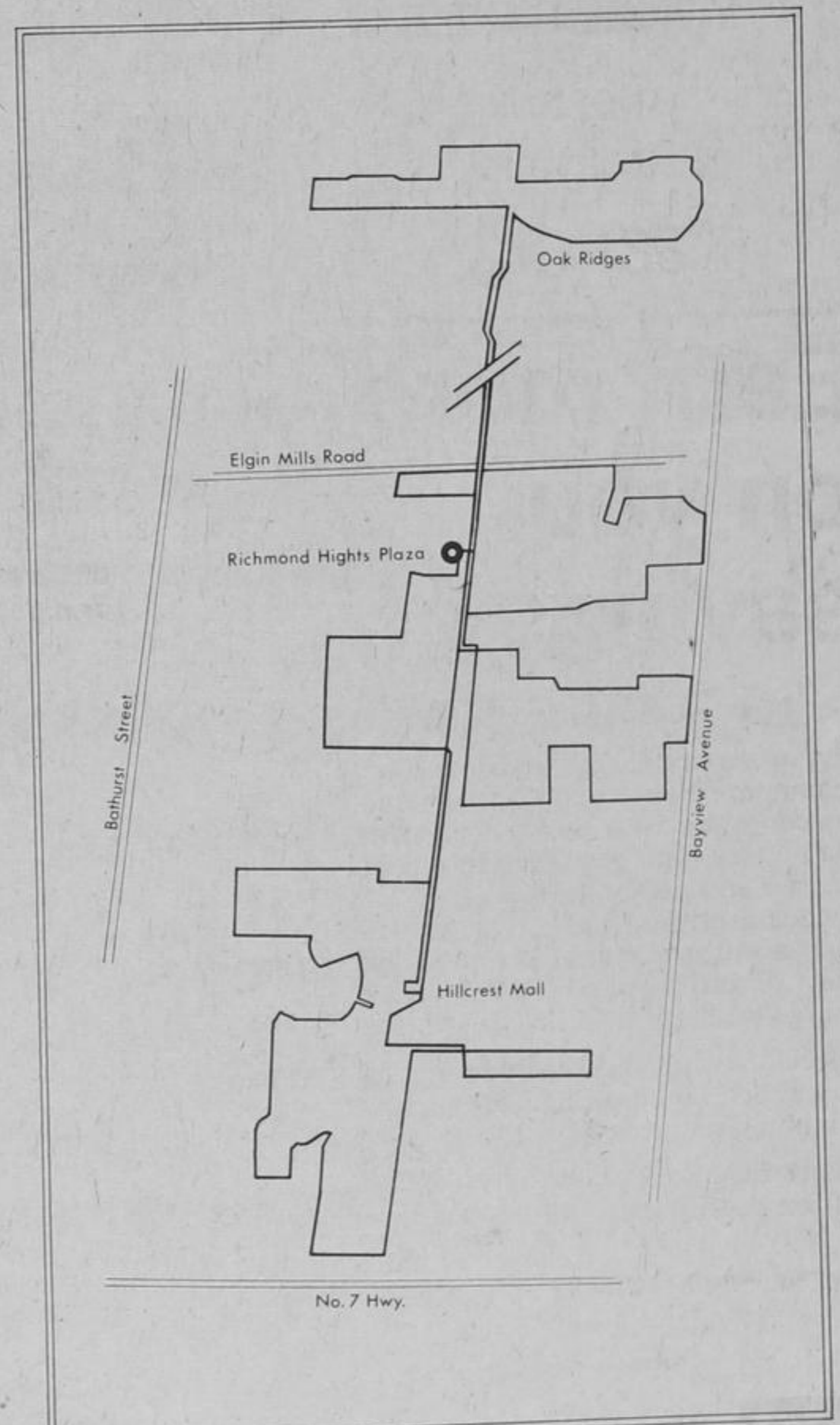
### How to find out when the bus comes by your house.
