

Varied events draw big crowd for fair

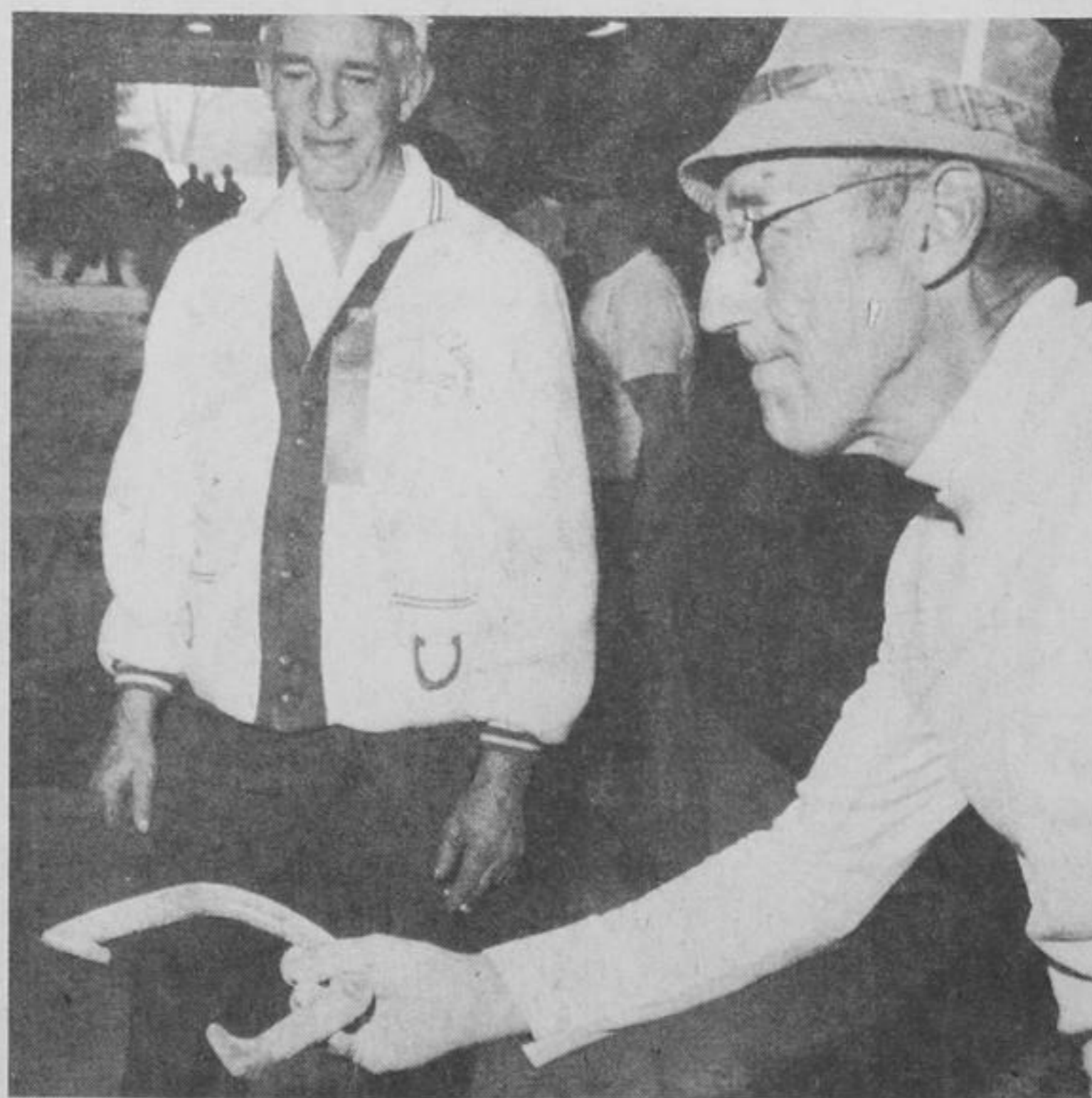


Sheep shearing

While a small crowd gathers to watch intently, farmer Irwin Jackson of Rockwood gives a demonstration of sheep shearing. It

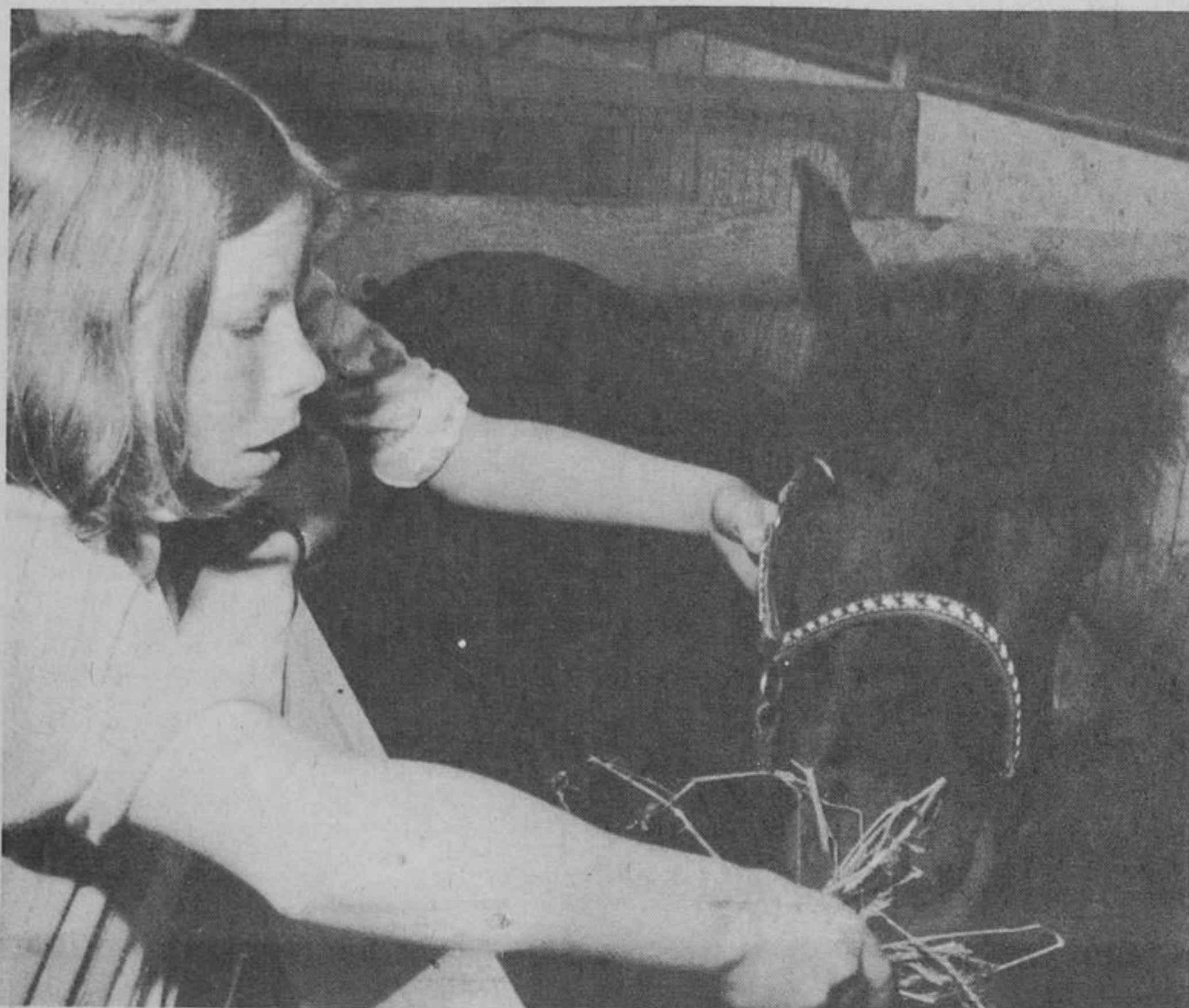
was one of dozens of agriculture-oriented activities for fair visitors.


