

There was also some concern over what is expected of a block parent. Mrs. Mover explained the volunteer would be provided with a luminous sign, which would be placed in a conspicuous window, and which could be removed when the block parent was away, or simply not available to the children.

Block Parent responsibilities would include providing shelter for children who were lost, hurt, or approached or molested by a stranger, and calling the police for assistance, and keeping an eye out for suspicious persons or fights.


