Seatbelt blameless in death

TORONTO - A coroner's jury last week ruled out a seatbelt as being at fault in the death of a motorist who was thrown from his 1966 car in a collision with a tractor-trailer, Feb. 18 on Highway 7, half a mile east of Kennedy Road.

However, the jury recommended that seatbelts be constructed so they do not lose more than 25 per cent of their original strength over a 10-year period.

Michael Szabo, 40, of Willowdale, who was killed in the accident, was still wearing his belt when his body was found 30 feet from the crash.

Murray Hattin, a standards engineer for the ministry of transportation, said that standards called for the belts to withstand a pull of 6,000 pounds.

They also allow for a loss of between 25 and 40 pe cent of the original belt strength through abrasion, light and microorganisms, Hattin said. He said that the

Continuing until the end of May is an exhibition of paintings by Khatcho, a local artist.


