Guest speaker at the show was George Osborne, a Bowmanville resident who has an unusual hobby.

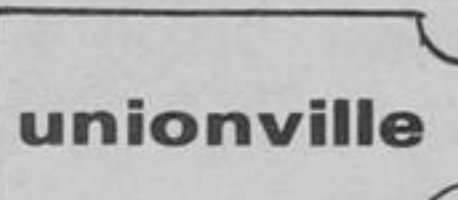
He finds unusual pieces of wood, and shines and varnishes them for display.

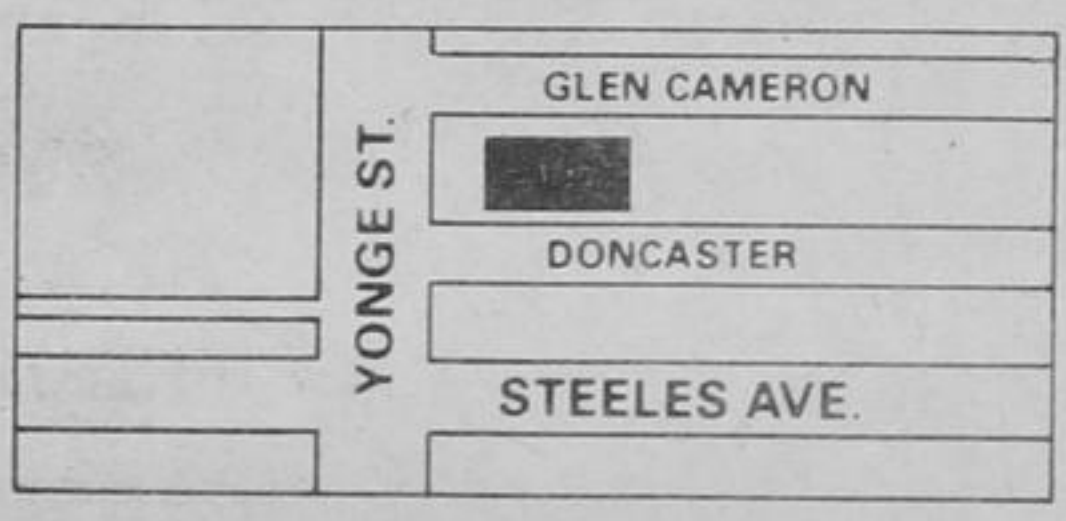
