The following water rates have been adopted by Council for water consumed during the quarterly billing period ending June 28, 1976 and thereafter until further notice.

Extract from By-law 98-76, Schedule "A"

- \$10.00 minimum per quarter for a single unit which pays for 7,000 gallons.
- \$9.10 minimum per quarter for a multiple unit which pays for 7,000 gallons.
- If more than 7,000 gallons are used in a quarter the amount above 7,000 up to 500,000 gallons shall be at the rate of \$.80 per 1,000 gallons and the amount above 500,000 gallons shall be at the rate of \$.60 per 1,000 gallons.
- Plus 10% of the total of (a) and (c) or (b) and (c) as the case may be but this shall be forgiven if such total is paid by the due date.

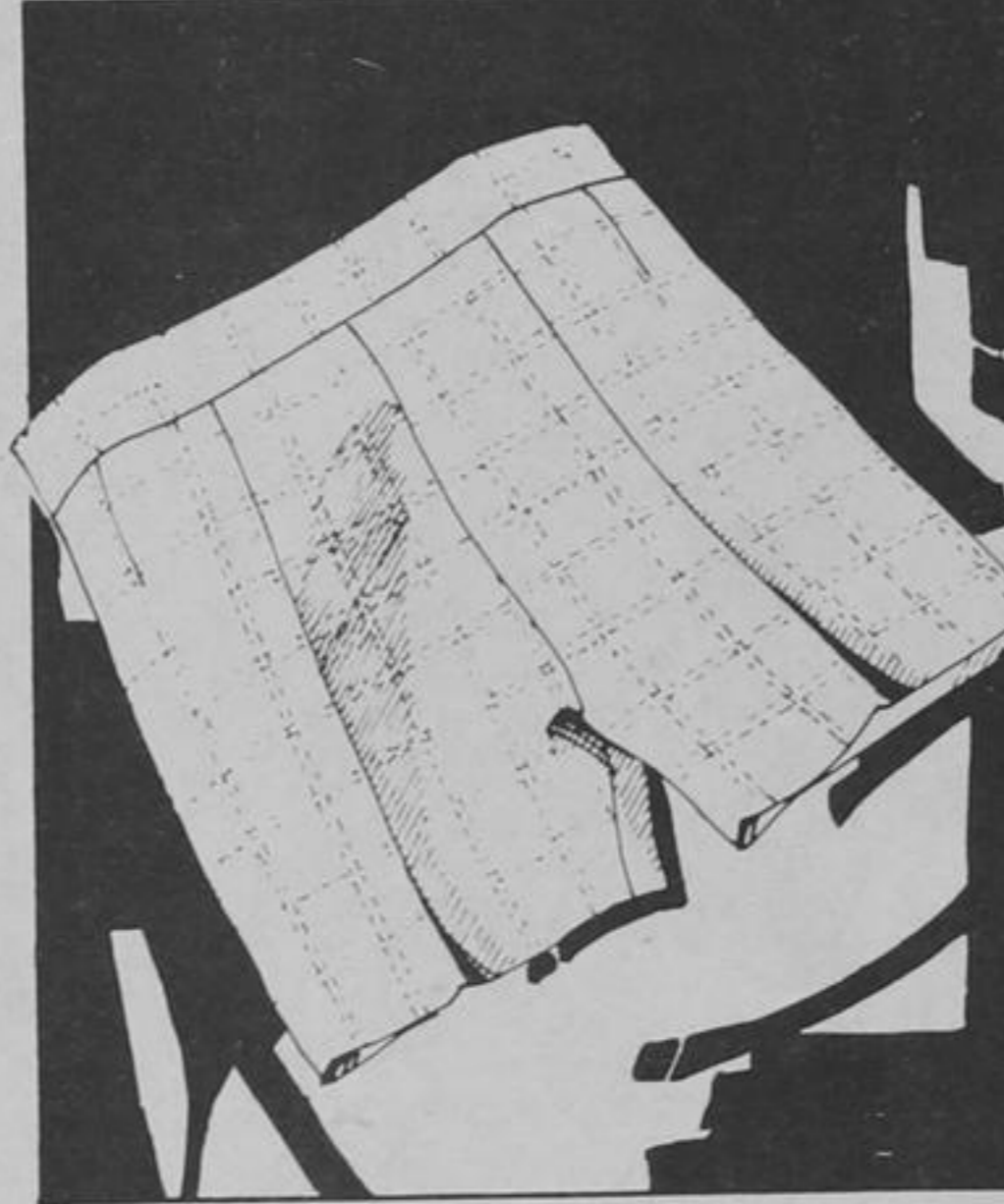
