# Jews celebrate holidays

In the fall the Jewish community will celebrate a series of important holy days. Rosh Hashana is the New Year (1537) and begins a period of self-examination and repentance lasting 10 days and culminating in Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement.

These are followed by Sukkot (Tabernacles) which commemorate the 40 years of wandering in the desert between the Land of Egypt and the Land of Israel. We are reminded by the sukkah (booth), that we construct that the Jews dwelt in frail abodes during their journey, and we also recall the frailty and precariousness of life itself.

The festival concludes with Simhat Torah (Rejoicing in the Teaching) when the yearly cycle of reading the Torah (Pentateuch) concludes and begins again.

We live in a period of intense self-concern, and it is hard to find an individual not involved in psycho-analysis, psychotherapy, group therapy, transactional analysis, parent effectiveness training, assertiveness training, transcendental meditation or Erhard Seminars Training.

ourselves is a worthwhile activity. We then must take the activity seriously. It is not a merely formal activity; we can make changes in ourselves and repentance involves a commitment to

change. In the season of repentance, Jews remind themselves of personal sin and human precariousness, but at the conclusion we also remember and rejoice in

the Teaching (Torah). Even in our frailty our lives are of ultimate worth and our purpose on Earth of ultimate significance. Surely this is a reason to rejoice!
