UNIONVILLE — Members of the Little Theatre of Markham are spending the summer months reading through the hundreds of plays from which they will choose next season's repertoire.

They will open their season a month earlier this year with a meeting early in September.

Tentative plans include a comedy for this fall, and a drama production next spring.

The reading committee, chosen for the summer's work, will narrow the selection to several plays, and decisions will be made by the group, and particularly the director.

The group now has about 30 very active, very enthusiastic members, not all of whom will be seen on stage.

As June Collins, a member of the group, explains, "Theatre is like an iceberg, three-fifths of which is under water."

Many members of the Little Theatre seem to find their best means of expression in creating scenery and sets, lighting effects, costumes, and defining characters through the use of makeup.

The group meets at least once a month from fall through late spring.

Through grants and professional assistance provided for the group by Theatre Ontario and Ontario Arts Council, workshops are available for new members and old — for anyone interested in learning many new facets of the art.

According to Mrs. Collins, one of the most popular workshops in recent years has been the subject of theatrical makeup. The workshops are taught by professional actors and theatre technicians and are arranged according to the group's interests.
