Board considers United Way plea

AURORA — York County board of education will take another look at a plea by the United Way of York Region to approve a voluntary payroll deduction program for its staff.

Bob Higgs, executive director of the United Way, told the board that, while he appreciated its approval of the campaign, he was concerned it hadn't extended approval to the payroll program.

"The only way the United Way can be successful is through business confidence and the voluntary payroll deduction," he said.

Reports in the press of the board's decision not to go along with it had "eroded public confidence on the part of the United Way."

Education director Sam Chapman said it was a matter of time. The board needed 28 days to work on the program.


Higgs said he was prepared to supply volunteers who would assist the board in determining any problems and helping them resolve them. He said, too, the board might be able to get an


