UNIONVILLE — The Unionville minor hockey womens auxiliary, which opened a craft shop last week in the former tuck shop facilities at Crosby Arena, have had great success in their first week of operation.

Auxiliary member Shirley Moyer says they have sold "at least one of everything", and some items like hostess aprons and baby outfits are selling as quickly as they can be supplied. The group is already asking for more items to be made that they can put up for sale in the booth on a consignment basis.

Close to 30 volunteers are donating their time to operate the shop. Each works a two-hour shift

and is called upon once a month.

Due to its popularity, the craft shop's hours have already been increased to accommodate figure skating club members and other skaters as well as hockey players. The new hours are now in effect, and they are: Mondays from 4 to 6 p.m., Tuesdays from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m., Wednesdays from 4 to 5 p.m., Saturday mornings from 10 a.m. till noon, and Sundays from 10 a.m. till noon and 1 to 7 p.m.

Block parents
At a meeting of the Unionville Block Parents

committee last week, it was reported that over 200 block parent signs have been distributed to Unionville homes.

Also discussed was the final preparation for a note system which is being implemented in the public schools. Parents will shortly be receiving newsletters informing them about this system, as soon as it is ready to be put into effect.

By using the note system, which requires the parents of a child who is home from school to notify the school by phone or a note sent with another child, the school will be aware im-

mediately of which children are going to be home that day. An emergency can, in this way, be more quickly detected if a child is not present at school and the school has not received a note or phone call.

The committee has also been busy with two bake sales to raise funds for teaching aids and materials. The first was held for students of William Berczy School in their lunch hour on Oct. 14, and another was held this morning (Wednesday), for children attending Parkdale.

Walt Disney animated films featuring the cartoon character Timothy the Mouse were purchased with the bake sale money, and these films will be available to Unionville and other area schools for educating

students to the block parent program.

The committee is also attempting to organize the showing of a full length feature film as well as cartoons for the children, for a Saturday afternoon in the near future.
