BBB creates panel

The Better Business Bureau of Metropolitan Toronto and the Floor-covering Institute of Ontario are joining forces to create a business panel which will serve as a problem-solver in disputes between consumers and floorcoverers and will be a voice for the floor-covering industry with government.

Following the example of BBB's Dry Cleaning Panel which has been in successful operation for a number of years, the Floor-covering Panel will address itself to complaints that have

not been resolved by regular BBB complaint procedures.

The five-member panel will consist of specialists in the fields of textiles, tiles, and installation, to be drawn from the Floorcovering Institute, together with two specialists from outside the Institute.

The BBB is making tentative plans for other panels, among them a panel of furniture dealers. The organizational meeting for the Furniture Panel is to be held on Nov. 10, and furniture dealers, who are interested should phone the Bureau for particulars.

YCH Auxiliary donates new equipment

RICHMOND HILL — The York Central Hospital Auxiliary donated a \$2300 Ohio Infant Transport Incubator last week for use at York Central Hospital to transport seriously ill new borns to selected hospitals for special treatment. The incubator permits increased oxygen levels to be maintained and

regulates the temperature so that it is held constant at 90 degrees fahrenheit. Research concerning transporting babies has shown that one of the greatest problems has been the inability to maintain body temperature at a satisfactory level. The new incubator can be heated

to 90 degrees in 15 minutes and due to an attached "aircraft battery" can maintain a constant temperature. Transport incubators used previously were not battery equipped and consequently reliant on adequate ambulance attachments for temperature control.
