...cited for varied efforts

Hill library head honored

TORONTO — Patricia Hart, chief librarian at Richmond Hill Public Library, was presented with the Ontario Library Trustee's Association Award at the annual convention of the Ontario Library Association Saturday night at Ontario Place.

The award is given to a practising librarian who has made a significant contribution to the community, the profession or some aspect of library development in the province.

Mrs. Hart was cited as being "a professional in every sense of the word — librarian, historian, genealogist, author and recipient of the Centennial Medal, who truly believes in service to the public."

"As an historian she has instilled in the citizens of her town a sense of pride and an awareness of its history by nurturing an interest in its past happenings," the citation said.

Mrs. Hart was appointed town librarian in 1969, following similar positions in St. John's, N.B., Toronto and North York.

Since coming to the Hill she has seen the library system expand from one to three libraries and was instrumental in establishing one of the

first all-paperback libraries — one that has been used as a model for many others, and was the subject of a workshop at the Canadian Library Association Convention in 1975.

Her interest in local history and genealogy is exemplified in her work on Richmond Hill's

Centennial Committee, her active participation in the local historical society and the development of an important Canadiana and genealogy collection in the local library.

In addition to Patricia and Gil Hart, Richmond Hill guests at the presentation and dinner

included Adele Downey, chairman of the library board; Mayor David Schiller and Mrs. Schiller, George and Persis Abram, and Matt and Maureen Stephenson. Mrs. Abram and Mrs. Stephenson attended as representatives of Richmond Hill public library staff.

Two children killed in fire

YORK REGION — Two disastrous fires swept the region last week, killing two children and critically injuring their mother in one, and killing 19 horses in the other.

The first occurred at the King Township home of Englebert and Dallis Dietl on Dearborne Avenue, about 12:40 a.m., Oct. 29.

Killed were David Dietl, 14; and his sister, Tosha, 5. Mrs. Dietl, 43, their mother, is in critical condition in York County Hospital, Newmarket. Her youngest daughter, Joshine, 2, is listed as fair. Both suffered burns and smoke inhalation.

Police said Mr. Dietl, 39, and his wife, were awakened by smoke and jumped out of their second-storey bedroom window with Joshine, and their 16-year-old son, Adre.

Mr. Dietl said he then got a ladder and climbed to the bedroom where the other two children were sleeping, but was unable to get them out.

Cause of the fire is unknown. The second fire occurred at the farm of Patricia Leonard, Concession 7, Whitchurch-Stouffville, Oct. 30, about 1 a.m.

The fire, whose cause also was unknown, roared through four barns, destroying 19 of the 55 horses there.

Owner Leonard was in England, but returned Saturday following the fire.

Firefighters from Richmond Hill, Stouffville and Markham were on the scene for more than two hours, but were unable to save the barns, which had too much of a head start on them by the time they arrived.

Recycling depot newsprint now goes to local company

RICHMOND HILL — The local recycling depot has found a new buyer for the newsprint it collects — a local firm which can use all kinds of newspapers.

The firm, Premier Fibre of 169 Centre St. East, is a new company which produces insulation from a newspaper base.

Depot spokesman Dawn Osmond said the arrangement is very good news for the recycling movement.

"We no longer have to ship newsprint 99 per cent

back and white. Save your papers just as they are delivered, including glossy supplements."

Since the new requirements are much easier to fulfill, Mrs. Osmond said, "we are hoping many more people will save their papers and take them — or send them with a neighbor — to the recycling depot."

The depot is on the north side of Elgin Mills Road (18th Avenue), between Bayview and Leslie. It's open from 10 a.m. to noon each Saturday.
