

# Regional energy study urged

NEWMARKET — both in excess of AIB guidelines and didn't meet the standards of "user additional cost" under the guidelines.

It said, also, it had been demonstrated that Hydro could finance its power expansion program by staggering the proposed increases over a five-year period, lowering its bulk power cost to about per cent a year.

Mayor Bob Forhan of Newmarket suggested the resolution be supported. Whether the cabinet would roll back the increase remained to be seen, but "we must make sure there is a watchdog somewhere along the line."

Schiller said hydro consumption had gone down, whether through conservation or other means, and suggested a study be done to look at consumption patterns.

There were "great savings" to be made in

operating costs.

Councillor Eric Larsen of Georgina said it was "most disturbing" to see a 30 per cent increase granted, "when the rest of the world was held to eight per cent."

He said he "wholeheartedly" supported the roll back.

Richard Hill's Gordon Rowe said the region should share some of the blame, too. When Hydro had proposed transmission lines through the area several years, it had been delayed here, "but the need didn't go away."

Now "tremendous costs" had been added and must be picked up by Ontario Hydro.

His comments brought an instant rebuke from Forhan, who said most of the municipalities had approved of the lines in question; "the province took it on itself to delay it."

The motion by Schiller

for the engineering department study was approved, but not without some misgivings by Chairman Garfield

Wright, whose contention was that staff couldn't cope with the paper work involved.

Schiller. I'm sick and tired of the suggestions we need a mammoth study."

He said Richmond Hill was doing a similar study and there had been no suggestion from the town's much smaller staff that it couldn't handle it.
