

Mallon runs for RC board

THORNHILL — A 15-year resident of Thornhill and mother of six, June Mallon will seek a seat on York Region Roman Catholic separate school board in the December election.

Mrs. Mallon, 55, served on the first regional separate school board and on the local Thornhill board before regional government came into effect.

Although she says she has "no real axe to grind" she would like to see more communication between the board and parents and is concerned with "the cultural aspects of education".

She is a member of the parish council for St. Luke's church and past president of the Ladies of St. Luke.

Mrs. Mallon, a member of Markham public library board, says she will resign her position there by Nov. 11, to seek the school board seat.

Teachers told 'be careful' in psychological testing

TORONTO — Care with psychological testing of students has been emphasized by Dr. Harry Fisher, assistant deputy minister of education, in a memo to school principals and directors of education, it was reported in the October issue of Dimensions, a publication of the ministry of Education.

Fisher said rules should be set up governing the testing; in cases where the student is a minor,

parents' permission must be obtained. Students and parents must be assured that any such testing is done by competent personnel, and the results discussed with parents. The results would remain confidential beyond that.

The memo was issued because of concern expressed by the Ontario Psychological Association, which said that, due to the specialized nature of the

testing, it was anxious the tests be done by fully qualified psychologists and not by "teacher testers."

Similar alarm has been expressed by York County board of education, following the disclosure of a research department project among Grade 11 students in six area schools. The project delved into personal habits of the students by means of a questionnaire, which attempted to sort out over-anxious students and help build their "self-esteem."

The board has since recalled all the tests, which had been administered in secrecy, and it ordered them destroyed.

When questioned last week as to whether the board's directive had been carried out, chairman Douglas Allen said it was "as good as done."

The board also passed a motion stressing "the achievement of self-motivation and self-esteem through academic and personal skills."
