Olympic horse team at Toronto

TORONTO — Olympic excitement will be recreated as four Canadian riders who were barely edged out of a bronze medal represent Canada at the Royal Horse Show here Nov. 12 to 20.

Belgium, winner of the Olympic Bronze Medal with 63.0 faults and the fourth placed United States with 64.0 faults forced Canada with their 64.5 faults into fifth place.

These three teams meet again at the Royal. The highly competitive Irish team and top individuals from Australia and Holland will add to the exciting action.

Canada is looking for a comeback with the following top riders.

Team Captain Jim Elder has been an international competitor for 25 years. His international wins include four Pan American Games team medals, a Gold in 1959 and 1971, and a Bronze in 1967 and 1975.

He has won two Olympic team medals, a

bronze in 1956 and a Gold in 1968 in Mexico.

Jim Day has represented Canada in three Olympic games and this year in Montreal became the first to ride in both the Grand Prix Jumping and Three Day event in the Olympics.

His international wins include a team Gold Medal in the 1968 Olympics in Mexico and three Pan-American games medals, a team Bronze in 1967, Individual Gold in 1967 and Team Silver in 1975.

Other members of the team are Ian Miller and Michel Vaillancourt. Reserve rider is John Simpson.

Retriever trials at Cold Creek Sunday
