She helps the blind

THORNHILL — Karen Newton, a Grade 13 student at Thornlea Secondary School, spent her summer teaching water-skiing.

Pretty cushy job, eh? Not really. Karen worked at Lake Joseph, about 24 miles south of Parry Sound, where the CNIB has a holiday centre.

All her students were blind. "It's like a family lodge," says Karen.

"Almost anything any other camp would do, we would do." Activities included hiking, swimming, dancing, crafts and even a ham radio operation.

Second summer

It was Karen's second summer at the camp and especially important to her because she was promoted from the position of counsellor to become the assistant head of water-skiing.

From her experiences at Lake Joseph, Karen has concluded blindness is often related to other handicaps, such as diabetes. "Quite often the eyes reflect the state of health of the rest of the body," she says. The highlight of Karen's summer was the first time she watched one of her pupils, totally blind, finally get up and ski.

Articulate gal

The articulate and energetic 18-year-old lives with her parents Roy and Ruth Newton, and brothers Brian, 16, and

Robert, 12, on Babcombe Drive in Thornhill.

Last fall, Karen conducted a drama workshop for children at Thornhill Community Centre Library. After finishing this year at Thornlea, she will go on to university and a course in rehabilitation-related social work. "Basically," says Karen, "I just like people."
