THORNHILL - Karen Newton, a Grade 13 student at Thornlea Secondary School, spent her summer teaching water-skiing.

Pretty cushy job, eh? Not really. Karen worked at Lake Joseph, about 24 miles south of Parry Sound, where the CNIB has a holiday

All her students were blind. "It's like a family lodge," says

It was Karen's second summer at the camp and especially important to her because she was promoted from the position of counsellor to become the assistant head of water-skiing.
