When I left he seemed concerned as to whether I could make it back to the office. Puff, puff, nothing to it, puff, puff.

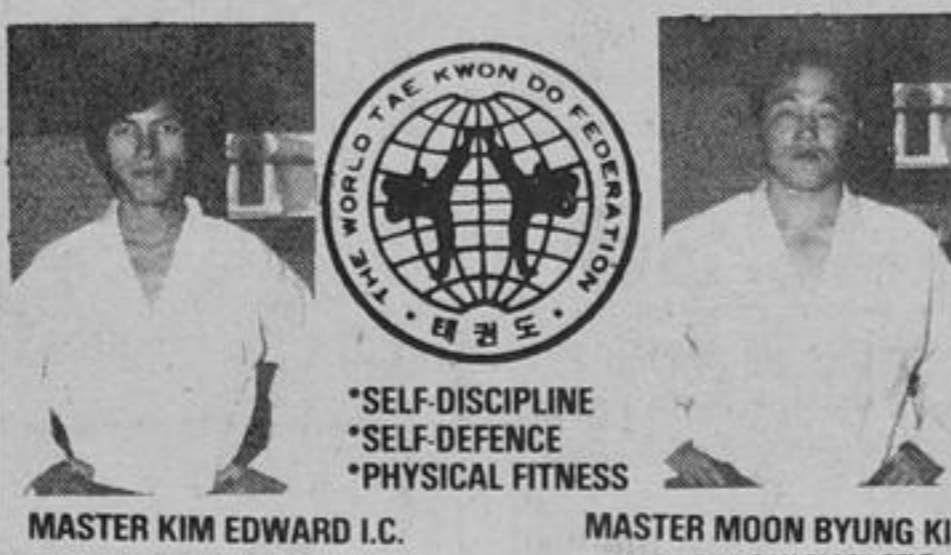
Bigger house parties

Apprenticeship training prepares people to enter skilled trades and earn a better living.



This is what Ontario is doing to help provide that training.

Ontario's growing economy has created a continuing need for qualified individuals in all fields, and especially in the skilled trades.

To meet this demand, the Ontario Ministry of Colleges and Universities Apprenticeship Program offers systematic on-the-job training and related classroom instruction in many trades.

Depending on the trade, an apprenticeship varies in length from 2 to 5 years, and apprentices are paid an increasing percentage of the going rate for fully-qualified tradespeople. At the conclusion of the training period, an apprentice will qualify for a Certificate of Apprenticeship and, where applicable, a Certificate of Qualification.

Your Ontario Government has prepared a special booklet, "Training for the Skilled Trades", which describes the apprenticeship program, lists the trades which it covers and explains how to get into the program.
