With only 15 seconds remaining it was David Abernathy passing the puck to Gelineau who banged home the tying goal.

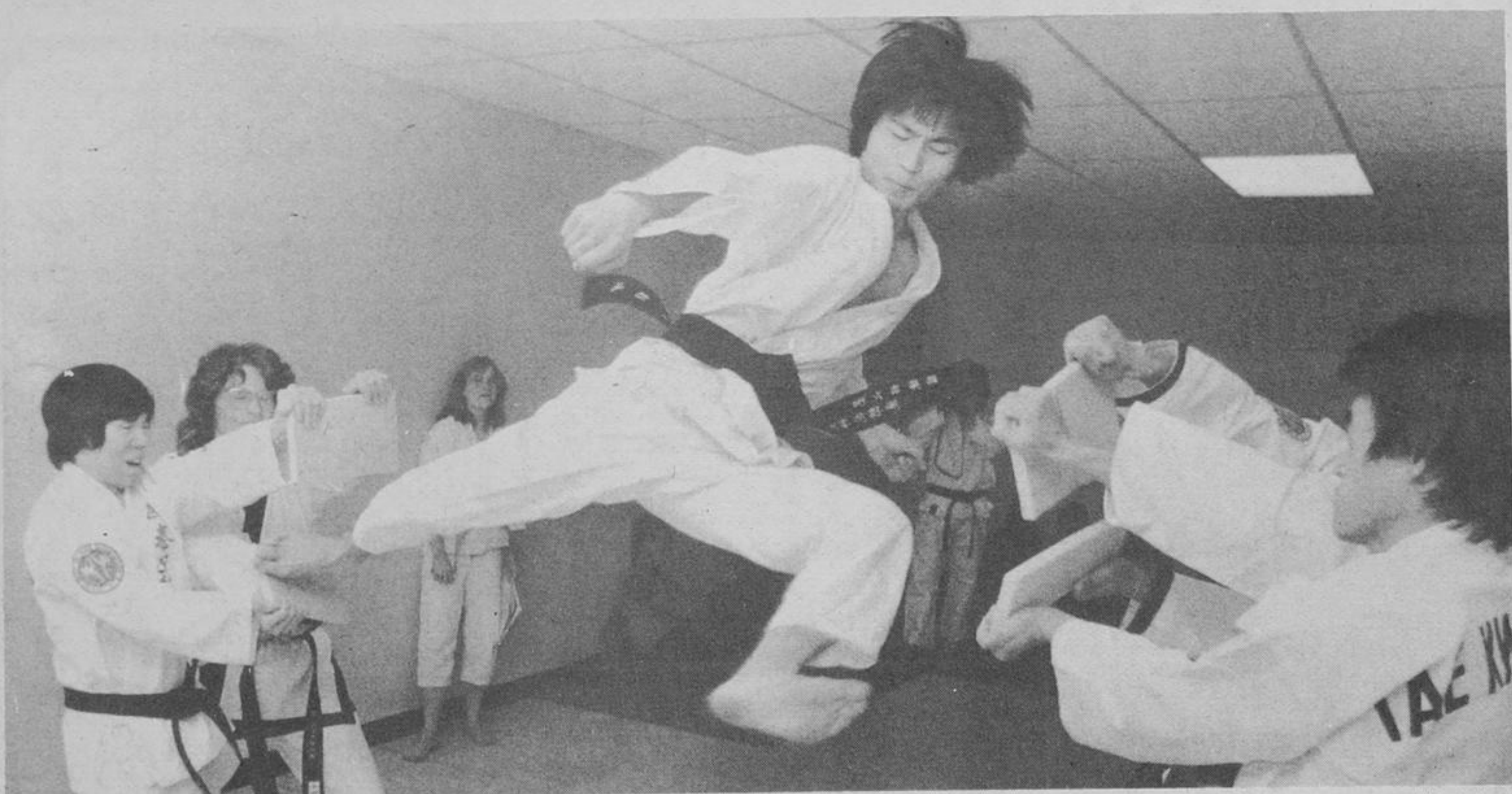
In the first meeting between these teams Oct. 24, it was Orillia winning 5-0.

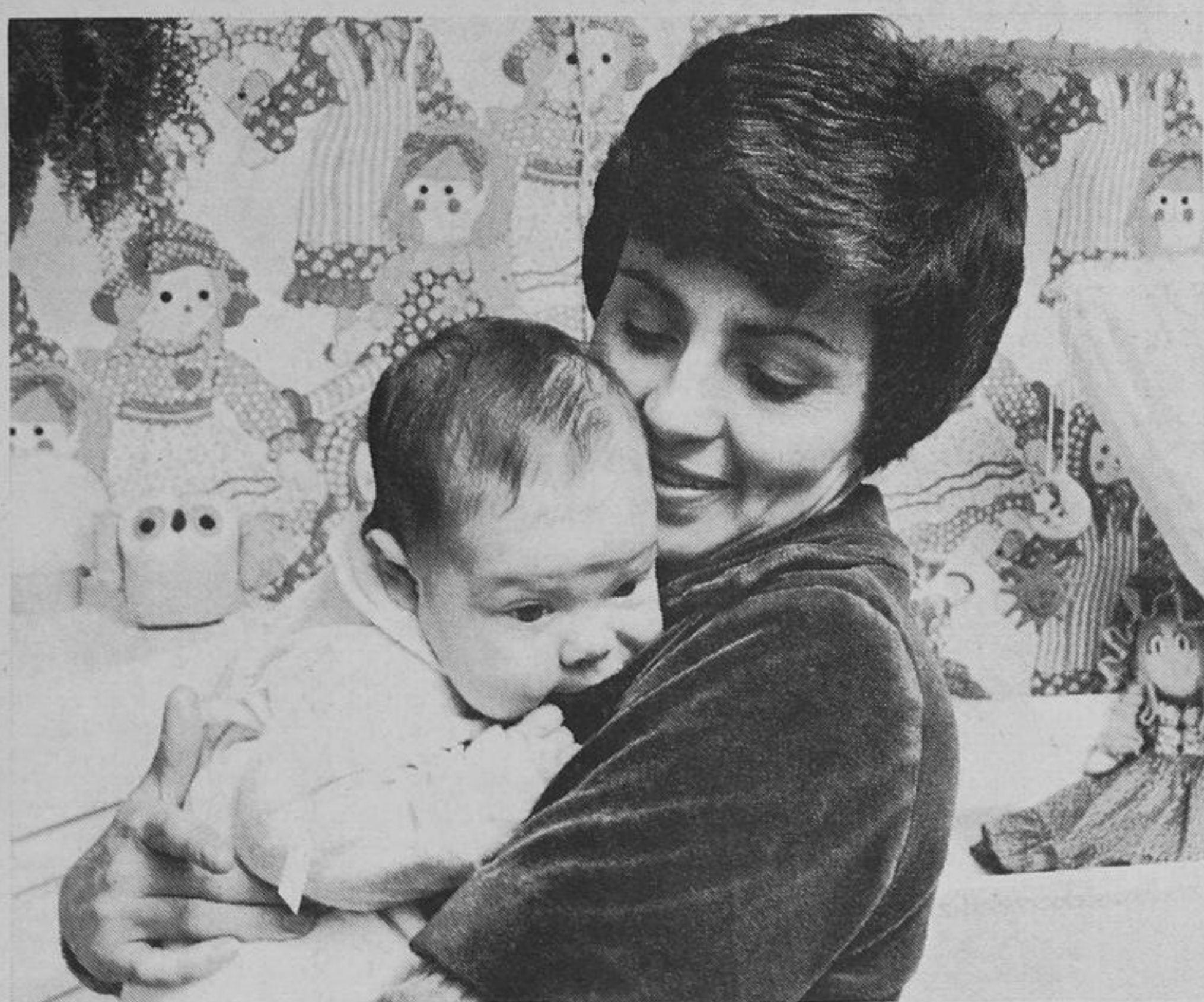
Aurora managed to get on the score sheet twice more but Steve Madden finished off the scoring for the winners.
