

Candidates queried at Ward 3 meeting

RICHMOND HILL — Ward 3 Ratepayers sponsored the first all-candidates night last week at Walter Scott School and kicked off the election campaigning before an audience of about 100.

Three of the five nominees for school trustees were known to the public. Bob Houghton is at present on the board and spoke in favor of experienced trustees, though Cathy McDiarmid who has tried for the board before felt that experience wasn't everything.

"We've had an experienced board for the last two years," she said; "what are the results?"

Eric Baker has an extensive business and administrative background and spoke of the importance of working together with administration. He recognized how much money was being spent on education taxes and said one of his first priorities was keeping the education taxes down.

Bob Monroe also mentioned the importance of both trustees and administration working together and he spoke of improving communications

allround, between home and school, parent and teachers, trustees and the public.

Ilgia Irbe made her maiden speech at the meeting. She said she is interested in all facets of education, though she has no children of her own.

Ward 3 Candidates for Councillor spoke. Ray Gemmill wanted more industry in the town and more development. He said that in his own construction work he has to travel outside Richmond Hill and that he would rather work in the town.

Councillor John Birchall reminded

the public that there are plans for industry, but these are controlled plans, while Gemmill after being questioned suggested Church Street be opened up, with a possibility of mobile homes in the town.

Gemmill said Richmond Hill could not and should not remain a small town and that people wanting such a place to live should move elsewhere.

There are two regional councillors to be elected and the voters must choose between Lois Hancey, Eric George and Lou Wainwright.

Mrs. Hancey and Wainwright both

have extensive knowledge of the town and region and have served on various committees.

George told of his interest in local government and all three candidates agreed that regional government was a great idea in principle, though it did not always appear to work well.

The sparks began to fly when mayoralty candidate Gordon Rowe attacked Mayor Dave Schiller's tax increases with sheets of statistics going back five years. Schiller pointed out that this present council (in operation for only two of those five years) had

been left with bills from the previous council, of which Rowe was a member.

When asked by a member of the audience why he had not attended any of the 60 public meetings for local input, Rowe said people could always phone him if they had any questions.

Rowe favoured more industry and development in Richmond Hill. Schiller also recognized a need to encourage industry but wants to ensure that this is well planned and does not detract from keeping Richmond Hill a pleasant place to live.
