We urge the public to take an active interest in the election, ask questions of the candidates, and vote for whoever they feel will provide sound decisions. The CAG is not endorsing any particular candidates in this election.

That, however, does not and cannot prevent people interested in the activities of CAG from becoming involved as individual citizens in supporting the candidates of their choice.

As a gesture of impartiality, I as the chairman of CAG, will not be working for any candidate.

We have prepared a

council attendance record for 1975-76 and a voting record which will be available at the various public "candidates" meetings.

Enclosed is a list of the jobs and responsibilities of the nine people we elect to council.

We should be at least equally careful of the three trustees we elect who will be responsible for spending the other 50 per cent of our municipal taxes. The list of responsibilities we suggest is as follows:

- 1) Makes laws (called by-laws) for

- 2) Studies and approves policies and programs.
- 3) Approves annual budget (what money is to be spent for and how it is to be collected via grants and taxes).
- 4) Hears delegations; citizen complaints; correspondence.
- 5) Enters into agreements and contracts with other governments (local, regional, provincial).
- 6) Approves development plans.
- 7) Ensures provision of good services.
- 8) Decides on departmental organization and staffing.
- 9) Pick senior staff; decide on pay levels.
- 10) Reviews municipal administration (programs, expenditures, revenues) to make sure they are correct. (Note role of committees of council).
- 11) Acts as troubleshooter — decide what to do if things go wrong.
