PLANARIANS — Planarians are small (0.5 - 3.0 cm) aquatic flat worms distantly related to the parasitic tapeworm. Unlike these relatives, planarians are free-living, moving over the surface of the mud or rocky bottoms of streams or ponds. The animals "glide" over a solid surface by co-ordinated movement of short microscopic hairs which cover the lower portion of the body. Eye-spots serve as light detectors and the "ears" are actually organs of taste or smell. Planarians feed on dead or living animal matter, sucking it up with a hose-like pharynx or feeding organ.
