PLANARIANS - Planarians are small (0.5 - 3.0 cm) aquatic flat worms distantly related to the parasitic tapeworm. Unlike these relatives, planarians are free-living, moving over the surface of the mud or rocky bottoms of streams or ponds. The animals "glide" over a solid surface by coordinated movement of short microscopic hairs which cover the lower portion of the body. Eyespots serve as light detectors and the "ears" are actually organs of taste or smell. Planarians feed on dead or living animal matter, sucking it up with a hose-like pharynx or feeding organ.
