Kleinburg man in trustee race

KLEINBURG — The main purpose of the board of education, so far as candidate Gordon McBean of Kleinburg is concerned, is "to provide the best basic education possible within the financial constraints."

And to do that it must look at three things: The first is the quality of education, and to offset the present decline, there must be a "strong core curriculum, including English, mathematics, Canadian studies, science and physical and health education," McBean

Recognized standards must be implemented in both secondary and elementary schools, with available financial resources applied first to the classroom.

"The second issue is the efficiency of the board's operations," he said.

He would insist on a continuing examination of the whole operational system to ensure its maximum efficiency and to avoid overspending. The board must set an example for the whole system, while the administrative end should be more responsive to both the board and the schools.

"The question as to whether an administrative and support structure of 700 persons is necessary, needs to be closely examined," McBean said.

"For example, do we really need both superintendents of areas and area superintendents?

Planning, especially in the Town of Vaughan, was cited as the third issue by McBean. He said that new developments, such as the Thornhill-Vaughan and Pine Valley Village plans would mean "a continually growing population.

EAST GWILLIMBURY - Peter Silverman, who is running for the seat on York County board of education vacated by Joy Horton, believes "the primary role of a trustee is to ensure that the children

of York receive the education they need and deserve. "Trustees, by the policy they formulate, can have more effect on the lives of their children than every doctor and lawyer in the whole of York," Silverman

The board must regain the right to make policy, he said, with more resources "channelled into testing across York at the grade 8 level and at the grade 13

"Canadian history and literature must be emphasized so that students know about their country," Silverman said.

As a representative, he would like to see the children leaving the system "able to cope with the world as it is."

Silverman is a correspondent with Global TV News, and at present is acting host on "Code 1078," a program dealing with famous Canadian unsolved murders.

He also covers news assignments and is a contributor to articles to Financial Post and other publications.

He was a captain in the Canadian Militia, and has a BA, MA and Ph.d. He also taught in the British Secondary Modern Schools and has lectured at the University of Toronto and University of Cape Town, South Africa.

If you are a Canadian citizen or other British subject, 18 years of age on or before polling day will attain the age of 18 years and resided in the Town of Markham between September 7th and October 12th, 1976, or, having these qualifications, were a non-resident owner or tenant, or the spouse of a non-resident owner or tenant and your name was omitted from the list of Electors, you may PERSONALLY obtain a Certificate to Vote at the Town Clerk's Office, 8911 Woodbine Avenue, Markham, between 8:30 o'clock A.M. and 4:30 o'clock P.M. Monday to Friday.

If you are a qualified voter on Election Day and your name was omitted from the Voter's List, you are eligible to vote, on the prescribed form before your Deputy Returning Officer in the polling subdivision in which you qualify, and that you satisfactorily identify yourself to the Deputy Returning Officer.

If you have become a Canadian citizen since October 12th, 1976 and resided in the Town during the period September 7th, 1976 to October 12th, 1976 you may also PERSONALLY obtain a Certificate to Vote from the Town Clerk if you provide certification of citizenship but you cannot take the Declaration mentioned above before the Deputy Returning Officer on Election


