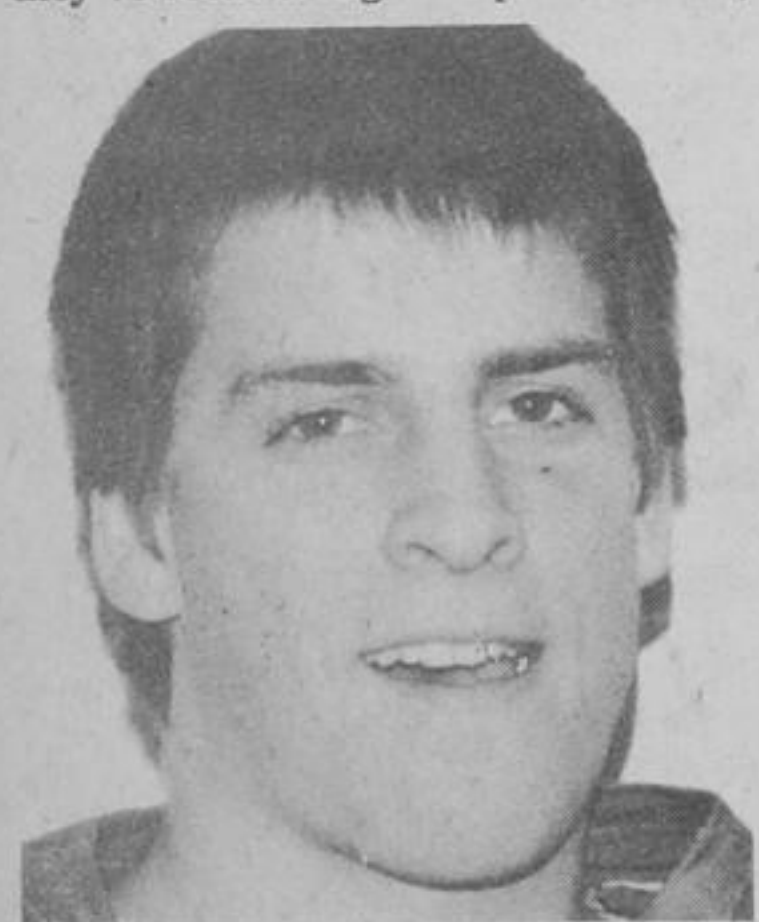

Weather conditions will not be a factor since retrievers are known as dogs which will brave the coldest water, search the

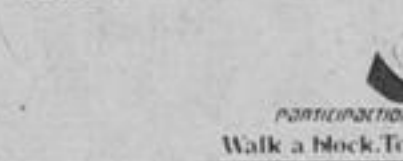
heaviest cover, and navigate the thickest mud and marsh, to retrieve their quarry.

JURISDICTION
To hear applications for minor variances to the Zoning By-laws of the Town and to rule on the legalization of each as provided under The Planning Act of Ontario.

Appointments: One member for a 3 year term

PARKS AND RECREATION COMMITTEE

JURISDICTION
To assist in the development and to recommend to Council policies which will improve the parks and recreation services of the municipality.

Appointments: Six in all, preferably one from each Ward

Special Note: The six regular members will be joined by five members of Council (including the Mayor) to comprise a Committee of eleven. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Committee will be a member of Council other than the Mayor.

The operating budget of the Parks & Recreation Department for 1976 was approximately \$604,951.00.

CIVIC IMPROVEMENT COMMITTEE

JURISDICTION
To assist in the development and to recommend to Committees of Council policies which will improve the physical and cultural amenities of the municipality.

FENCE VIEWERS

JURISDICTION
To arbitrate disputes pursuant to the provisions of The Line Fences Act of Ontario.

Appointments: Three Fence Viewers to serve a one year term.

LIBRARY BOARD

JURISDICTION
To serve as representative of the Municipality on the Library Board.

Appointments: One member for a three year term.

PROPERTY STANDARDS COMMITTEE

JURISDICTION
To hear appeals made against orders of the Property Standards Officer and to confirm, quash or modify the officer's orders.

Appointments: One member for a three year term.

LOCAL ARCHITECTURAL CONSERVATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

JURISDICTION
This Committee is established under The Heritage Act of Ontario and its purpose is to identify buildings of historic or architectural significance, and to recommend to Council their designation as such under the Act.

Appointments: Ten members for a One year term.
