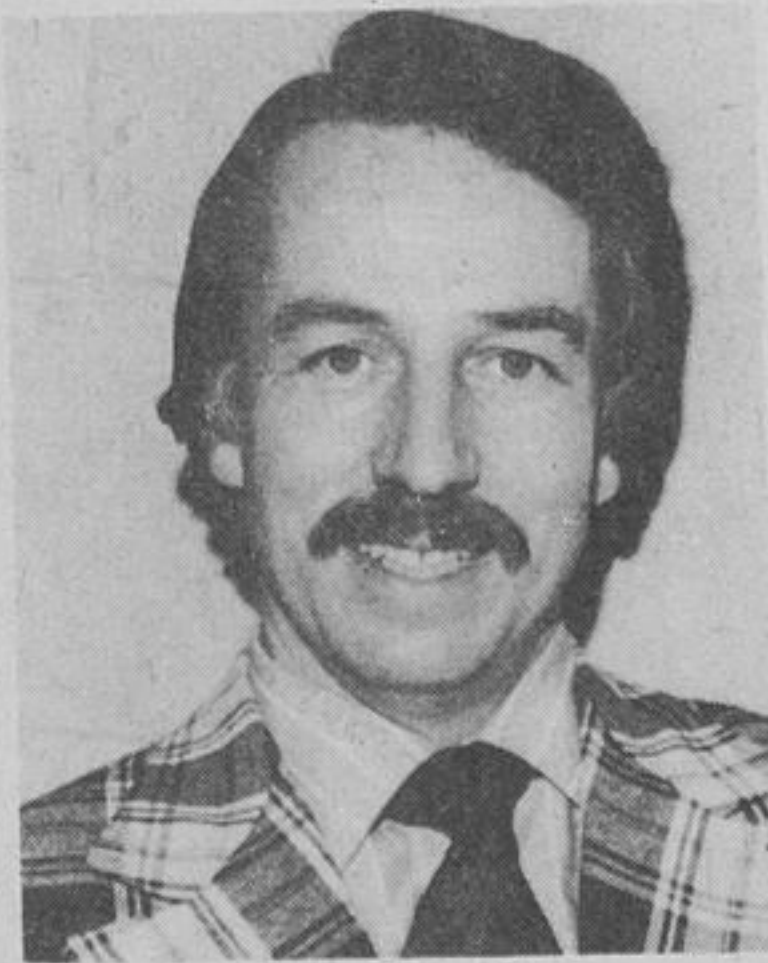
RICHMOND HILL — Crosby Sr. Public School principal, Dr. Peter Ross was appointed Monday to the new post of staff supervisor officer.
