**Time for clergy to share in worship**

RICHMOND HILL — Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, which comes near the beginning of 1977, raises hopes and frustrations. This year's theme, "Together in Hope" brings the promise and the practice of our unity — and the lack of it, into sharp relief.

Christians and Churches can and should be judged for shortcomings, but to be honest, we must see what progress has been made. Speaking personally, I grew up in the Protestant "solitude", hardly knowing the Roman Catholic priest in towns where we lived, and this year I was asked to read the Gospel and deliver the homily (or sermon) in a local parish church.

Marriage Preparation Weekends in the Richmond Hill area bring couples together from several Protestant traditions with Anglicans and Catholics. The local Ministerial will have as its new President, a priest, whom each of us as clergy in this area know and appreciate as a trusted friend. Laity and clergy from nearly all of our churches can share together now in worship, and witness to our common Lord, and translate that faith into community action.

But we acknowledge that we still have a long way to go. Divisions among us are to me, still a scandal before God and for many people. Rev. David Gray of the Presbyterian Church in

Ireland said at Nairobi last year, "...Divided churches cost lives... anguish of people now drives us to seek the unity we should have possessed long ago."

From a purely economic point of view we can remain separate as communions and churches for the present, (though perhaps not for

much longer), but from a spiritual and theological point of view, we must be more honest.

We are all committed morally or organizationally to the principle "to act together in all matters except those in which deep differences of conviction compel us to act separately" (the Lund Principle).

Now is the year, and ours is one of the places to make the most of gains made in concrete expressions and acts of unity, and to go forward to fulfil our Lord's prayer to be one so that the world may believe in Jesus Christ and the God who sent and gave him for our redemption. We are "on the road". Let's pray and work together so that we keep together!

**1977 ELDERLY HOMEOWNERS' TAX ASSISTANCE PROGRAMME**

To provide financial assistance to elderly homeowners, The Town of Vaughan Council has authorized the Treasurer to allow certain owners of residential property a credit of \$100.00 against the 1977 taxes imposed on such real property subject to the following qualifications:

**TO QUALIFY, THE OWNER OR SPOUSE OF THE OWNER MUST:**

- Be 65 years of age or more by February 28, 1977 which is the last day for filing applications.
- Be in receipt of the monthly GUARANTEED INCOME SUPPLEMENT provided under the Old Age Security Act (Canada).
- Occupy the property on which the municipal taxes are imposed and:
- Have been continuously assessed as the owner of such residential real property in the Town of Vaughan for not less than 5 years immediately preceding February 28, 1977.

If you qualify for this assistance and have not received an application form TELEPHONE W. H. YOUNG AT THE TOWN OFFICE, 832-2281, and an application form will be mailed to you.

Application must be made each year for this assistance. This credit, where allowed, will be an outright grant made by the Town and will not entail repayment of any kind.
