Baker was challenged by Cathy MacDiarmid, of Richmond Hill, following the Dec. 6 election after he beat her by 13 votes.

The recount was based on two ballots that were said to be in question. The latter were set to one side during Monday's recount and were not used in the final tally, which gave Baker 3,483 to 3,472.

At the time of the election, first returns showed Mrs. Mac-Diarmid the winner, but these were changed the next day after it was found that the telephoned results didn't match the district officer's tabulations.




