In the final minutes of the game, with two Richmond Hill players in the penalty box, Orillia scored to make a 1-1 tie.

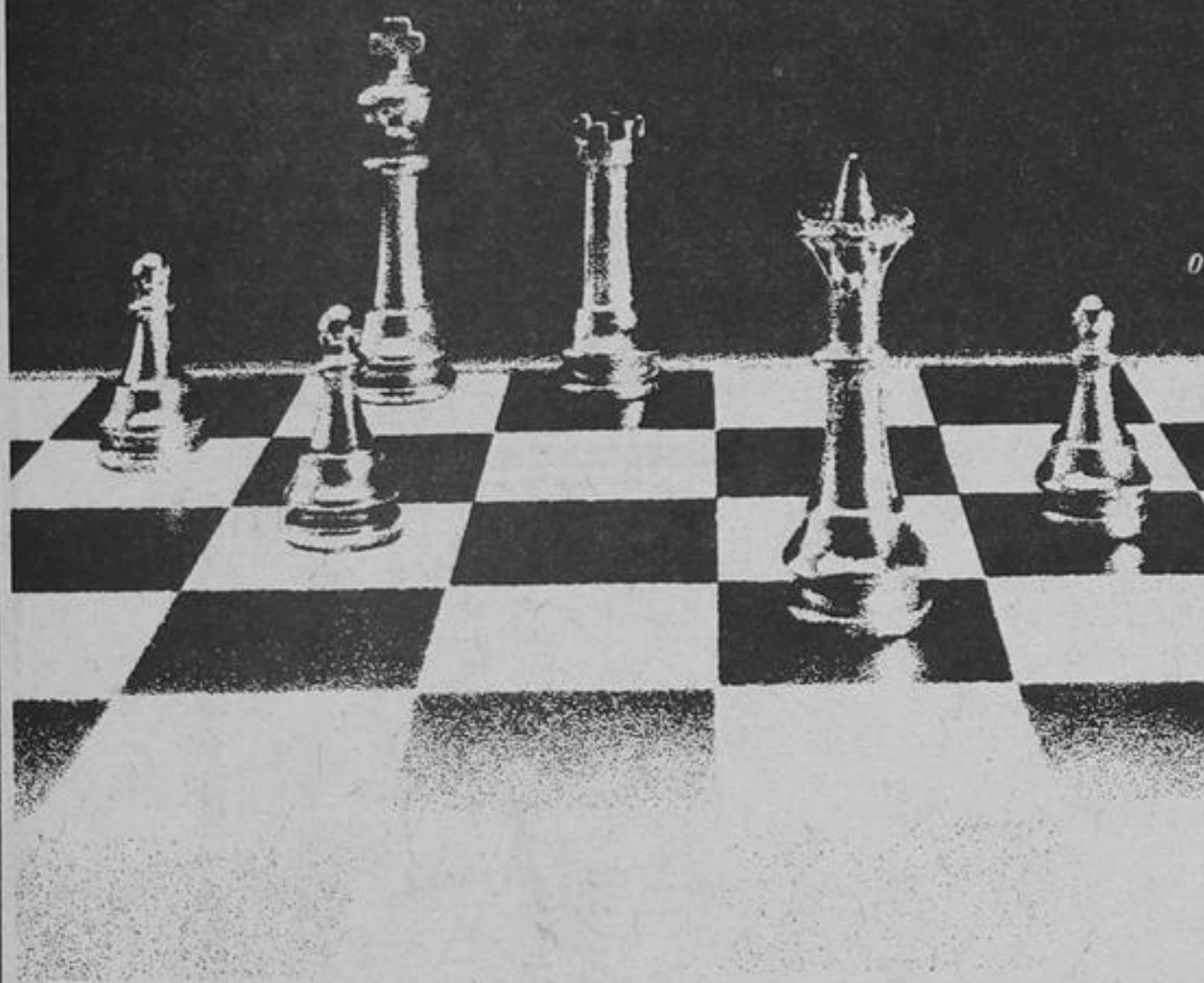
