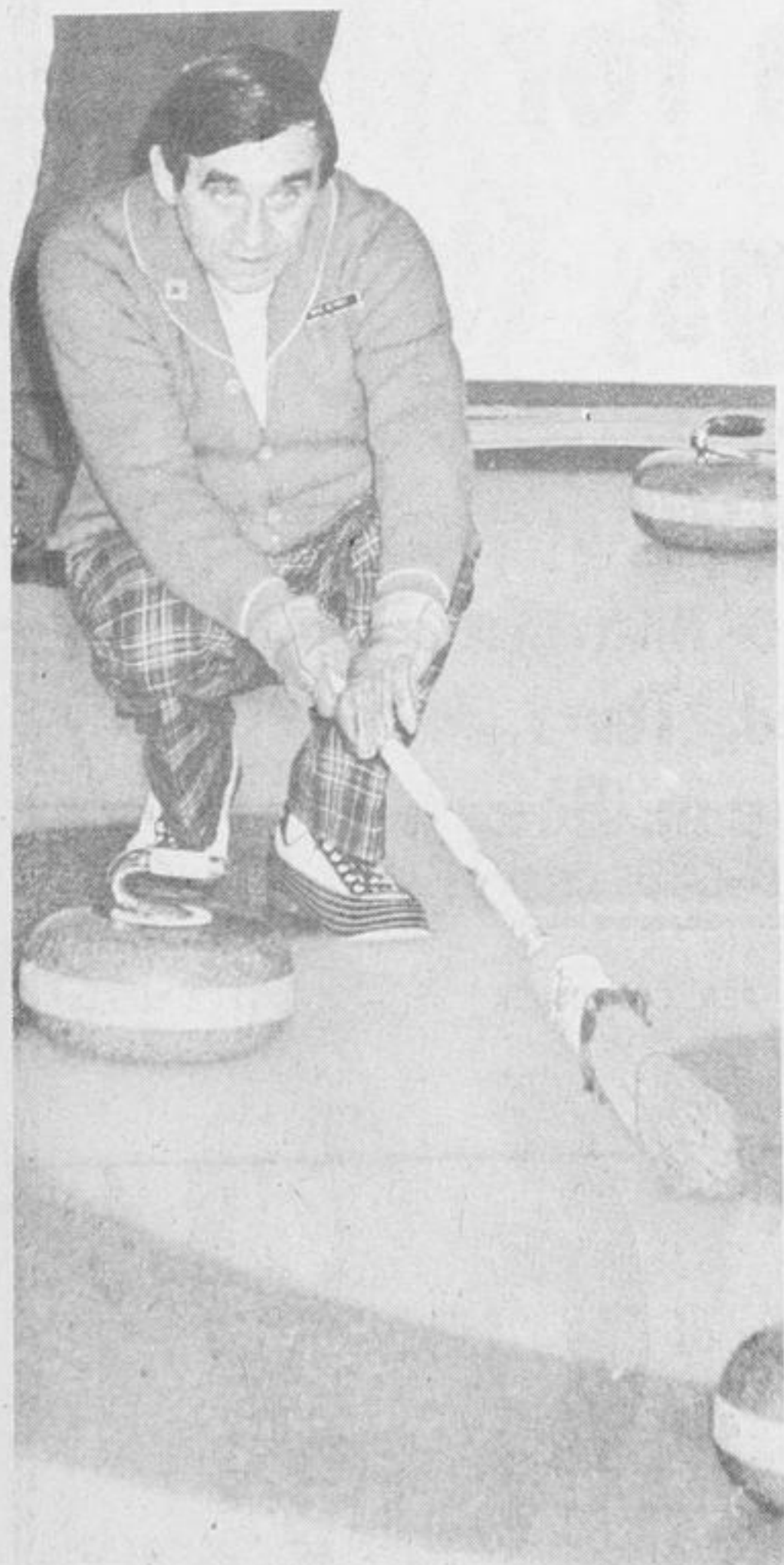
Clare Wood and her rink of Jean Evans, Marlene Turner and Carol Logan won the second high single prize.
