

Form soccer league for Hill, Thornhill

RICHMOND HILL — Minor soccer in the area will continue to boom on a new front this season with the recent forming of the Region of York Inter-District soccer league.

The league will embrace teams from Richmond Hill, Thornhill, Aurora, King City, Markham and Newmarket. Competitions will be at the squirt, atom, mosquito, peewee, bantam and junior level.

Trotman president
Heading the new league will be president Les Trotman of Richmond Hill.

Trotman has been associated with the Richmond Hill Minor Soccer Association as an executive member since its formation in 1968. He has served under four presidents, Rob Kernohan, John Elliott, Alan Beckwith and Ed Kenny.

Founding member
He is one of the association's founding members (along with Rob Kernohan) and feels the new league "is a good thing because it will allow other areas to become involved in competitive soccer and so upgrade soccer skills in these other areas."

The new league will be involved with the annual Adidas Skills Contest, Cup Competition and the Ontario Cup.

Trotman also commented that his executive "is a strong one, enthusiastic, hard-working and wants

to do everything possible to make the new venture successful.

"With the co-operation of the clubs associated with the league assured already, there is no reason to doubt that the Region of York Inter-District Soccer League will be a success," said Trotman.

Trotman added that "there is soccer strength out there in refereeing, coaching, publicity, equipment, finance, administration and enthusiasm. These are the real people who continue to expand soccer."

Other members of the executive are: Sal Mortelliti of King City, vice-president; Ron MacLachan, Thornhill, secretary; Bob Small, Aurora, treasurer; George Johnstone, Newmarket, match secretary; Bill Church, Markham, registrar.

Trotman, along with Kernohan, was instrumental in bringing about the first new Richmond Hill soccer field with floodlights at Crosby Park.

Likes tours
He's a "great supporter of tournaments and I feel they are of real value to the boys and girls both competitively and socially."

Trotman, along with other executive members, toured Britain in 1974 with the Mosquito team and is an advocate of such other tours to New Jersey, New York, Virginia, Washington, D.C. Miami and Mexico.
