To widen Yonge St.

RICHMOND HILL - Town council Monday gave approval to what is expected to be a satisfactory plan for the widening of Yonge St. (Highway 11) from

Major Mackenzie Dr. south to Highway 7. Councillors expressed surprise the provincial transportation ministry hadn't realized all the time what sort of widening would be reasonable.

The highway is to have two lanes in each direction plus a continuous two-way left turn lane down the centre, with what are termed "throat widenings"

There are to be separate bus bays. Barrier curbs are to separate pavement from the landscaped boulevard.

Sidewalks in areas approved by the town are to be

adjacent to the road allowance. There is to be continuous illumination with full hooded shields.

There is to be consideration of providing lighting from the east side of the roadway with high pressure sodium lights.




