The Mint is capable of producing 700 million coins per year on a fiveday week, one shift per day basis. Should demand exceed this rate of output, second and third shifts will be added, increasing effective capacity to 2.1

billion coins per year. The Mint's present equipment produces cents, nickels, dimes, quarters, 50 cent pieces, and nickel dollars. All coins are available for

general circulation. Production capacity is influenced by the size of coins produced.

For example, it requires larger machines operating at slower rates to manufacture a nickel dollar than it does to mint a penny.
