### Maple syrup time begins

RICHMOND HILL — It's maple syrup time again. The sap will soon be running in the sugar bushes of the Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority areas of Bruce's Mill and Kortright Centre for Conservation.  
Visitors will be able to see sap bubbling in big iron kettles over wood fires and the more modern adaptations of plastic tubes and vacuum pumps to turn the sap to maple syrup.  
Bruce's Mill is in sugar bush country and from March 12 until April 10, visitors can enjoy pancakes and maple syrup, and watch tree tapping and sugaring off operations on weekends and holidays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.  
This is the 10th con-

secutive year that maple syrup demonstrations have been featured at Bruce's Mill, which is located 2 miles east of Don Mills Road on the Gormley-Stouffville Sideroad.  
The Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority reminds parents that besides public demonstrations on weekends and holidays, there will

be daily demonstrations, during the winter school break (March 21 - March 25), at Bruce's Mill. The cost of enjoying this annual spring ritual of making maple syrup is a \$2 parking fee.  
The old fashioned and modern demonstrations of maple syrup production will be available again this year, for public viewing, at the Kortright Centre for Conservation.

This year the demonstrations have been expanded to include a short audio visual introductions in a portable classroom. The demonstrations will be held on Sundays only, from March 20 - April 17, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. There is a per person charge of \$1 per adult and 50 cents per child under 12, with a family maximum of \$3 per family. Parking is free.
