The first, second and third winners in all categories will now go to the County Fair at Bayview Secondary School, April 1.

NEWMARKET — York Region Police Commissioner Ray Twinney dropped a couple of "bombs" Thursday as another round in the dispute between the commissioner and the Police Chief Bruce Crawford continued.

Twinney said a police officer charged a boy with walking on the wrong side of the road.

A letter and a copy of the ticket received by Twinney from the boy's parents said the 16-year-old was walking with a girl friend on Dalton Road in the Sutton area when he was stopped.

The boy was given a \$28 ticket but the girl was not charged. Twinney called the incident a "disgrace" and added he intends to pay the boy's fine.

Twinney also referred to a King City man charged with driving 32 miles per hour in a 30 mile per hour zone.

After investigating the two incidents, Chief Crawford said the speeding ticket was withdrawn the day it was issued, while the "walking" ticket appeared to be justified.

The chief said a King City man was nabbed on Denison Drive Jan. 25 for travelling 32 miles per hour in a 30-mile zone. Radar was on the street at the request of the King Township council, the chief said.

After the ticket was issued, the officer had "second thoughts" about it, told the inspector on duty and was then told to go back to the man's home and tell him the summons would not be proceeded upon, the chief said.

The man returned the summons to the officer and the charges were dropped, the chief said.

Regarding the "walking" ticket, Chief Crawford said, "I frankly would have done the same thing" as the officer who issued the ticket.

On Feb. 22 an officer travelling north on Dalton Road in Sutton had to swerve into the opposite lane to avoid a youth walking in the same direction on the pavement.

A female companion was walking on the

car and waited for the pair to catch up, then asked them to cross to the opposite side of the road and walk on the sidewalk, the chief said.

The youth refused, saying, "it's too far out of my way". That's when the summons was issued, the chief said.

Meanwhile, figures released by Chief Crawford showed nearly 2,000 more tickets were issued in February over January by radar patrols, bringing February's total to 4,024 speeders.

Crawford said he felt it necessary to step up the radar enforcement in mid-January. He added that nabbing 4,000

speeders in one month verified his feelings.

The dispute between the commissioner and the police chief stems from a request for more personnel.

Crawford feels the force needs 20 additional men while Twinney believes the department is adequately staffed.

The issue has now become a question of traffic enforcement measures and the deployment of officers in the region.

In a prepared statement, on which the commission deferred action for two weeks, Twinney said half of York Region's available cruisers are on radar duty, while the rest must patrol the entire region.

## Doctor reprimanded

KLEINBURG — A Brampton anesthetist has been reprimanded by the Ontario College of Physicians and Surgeons in connection with the death of Mrs. Rita McVeety, 53, of Kleinburg.

Mrs. McVeety, 53, was in Peel Memorial Hospital for the removal

of a bunion from her foot. She died of massive brain cell damage because a "Y" connector unit in the anesthetic machine had a faulty internal valve.

An inquest jury warned of the faulty nature of Y-shaped hose connectors.

The anesthetist was Dr. Brian Alexander Nixon.
