Had knife William Widdifield, 42, of Rockport Crescent, faces a charge of having a dangerous weapon, following an incident at his home Mar. 13. Police said they were called to the house to investigate a domestic dispute and were met by a man wielding a steak knife. The man struck at them with the knife, but no injuries were reported, police said.

Win own court case

RICHMOND HILL — The old saying that he who acts as his own lawyer has a fool for a client, was disproved in provincial court here last week when a Toronto man had the case against him dismissed. Defending himself as Robert Springthorpe, Glamorgan Ave., who was charged with taking a car without the owner's consent.

He said he asked Springthorpe for the keys to the company car he used for the six to eight weeks he was employed. However, Springthorpe drove off in the car, Falkenberg said. After waiting half an hour for him to return, Falkenberg called police. Det. -Sgt. Brian Cousineau, York Regional Police, told the court he went to Springthorpe's dwelling, where the car had been taken. He said he cautioned the accused against theft and asked him why he took it. The accused told him he didn't know he had been fired and gave him the keys to the car, the officer said.

In his defense, Springthorpe said he had a release from the company that stated he was under employment for 13 weeks. The Labor Code stipulated he should have one week's notice and pay. Also, he paid \$20 a month for the use of the car and was charged \$10 by the plaintiff for half a month's use after the occurrence.

He said it wasn't the first confrontation he had with management, and always about money. He said he hadn't been 100 per cent sure he had been fired when he left and had even left his own car on the lot. Judge Russell Pearce said there didn't appear to be any intention on the part of Springthorpe to retain the car, and dismissed the case.

In another action, Bernard Gorless, 26, of Downsview, was given a three months jail sentence when he was convicted a third time of impaired driving. Judge Pearce refused the plea of counsel for the defendant that his client be allowed to serve his term on the weekends. Pearce said Corless knew his responsibilities, but had flouted the law
