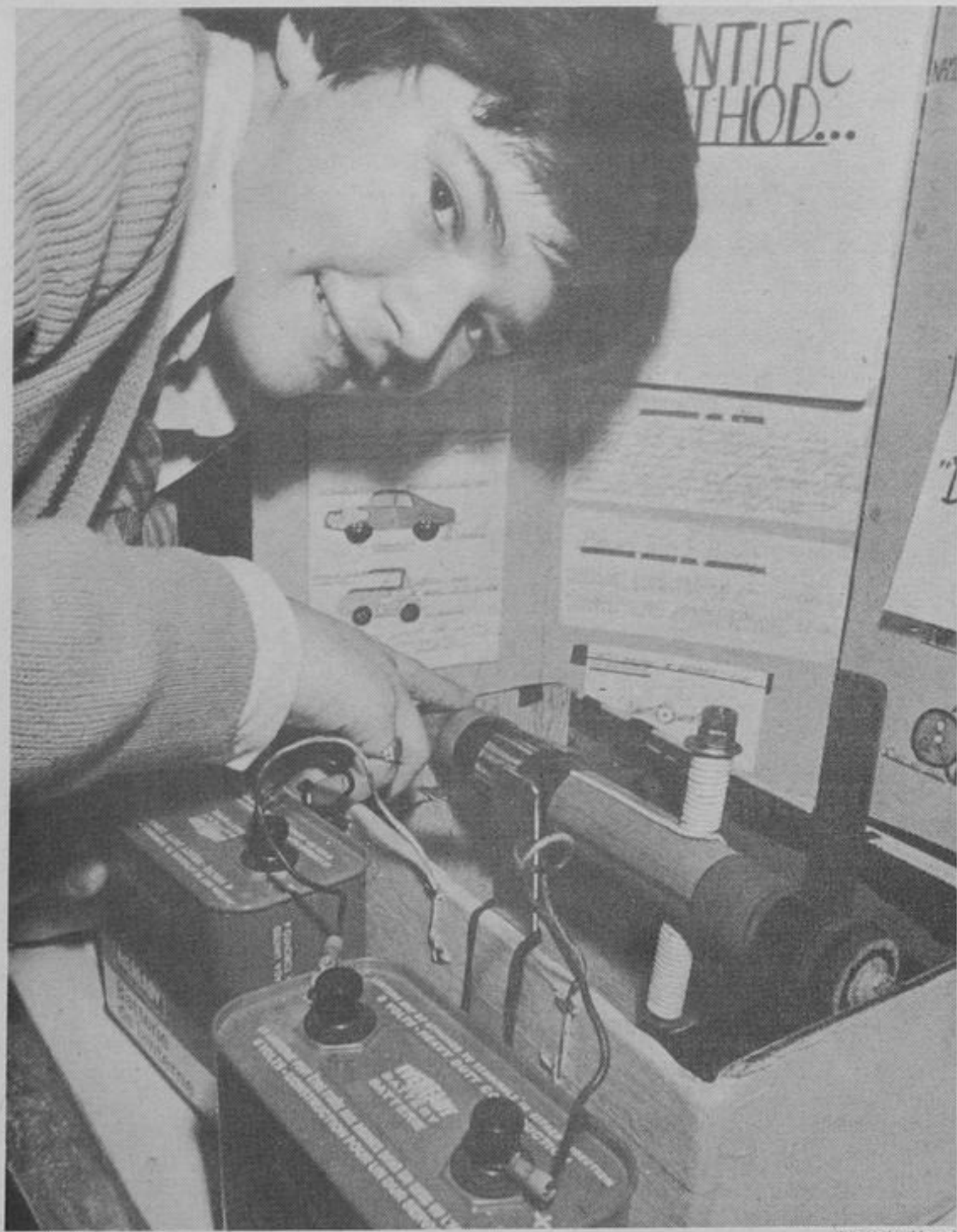


Modern Science at Area 5 Fair
