

THE THORNHILL-VAUGHAN COMMUNITY PLAN SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING Thornhill Public School - Tuesday, March 29, 1977

A draft Amendment to the Official Plan of the Town of Vaughan Planning Area has been prepared for the area bounded by the Parkway Belt West on the west and north, Yonge Street to Dufferin Street, Dufferin Street on the west from Steeles Avenue to the C.N.R. tracks and the C.N.R. tracks on the south from Dufferin Street to the Parkway Belt West.

This draft Amendment (Number 70) was presented to the public through a series of "open house" presentations on October 21, 22, and 23, 1976; consequently, some changes have been made to the document in accordance with Planning Committee recommendations.

The revised draft Amendment will be available for public viewing from March 22, to March 29, 1977, at the Gallanough Public Library which is located at the south end of Brooke Street, south of Arnold Avenue, one block west of Yonge Street in the Thornhill area of the Town of Vaughan.

The special Council meeting will be held at 7:30 P.M. at the Thornhill Public School which is located at the south west corner of the intersection of Arnold Avenue and Yonge Street in the Thornhill area, Town of Vaughan. All interested parties will have an opportunity at this meeting to make their views known to Council before it makes a decision to adopt the Plan.

It is the intention of the Coundil of the Town of Vaughan at the close of the special meeting to consider first and second reading of proposed By-law Number 70 - 77, being a By-law to adopt Official Plan Amendment Number 70 to the Vaughan Official Plan, together with any changes thereto that Coundil may consider appropriate. Council will consider the third and final reading of proposed By-law Number 70 - 77 at its regular meeting of April 4, 1977, in the Municipal Council Chambers at Maple.


