Want world's worst book?

WOODBRIDGE — Some of the world's worst books could be up for grabs when the H.E.L.P. organization holds its fifth annual book sale Saturday in Christ Church (Anglican), Islington Avenue, north of Highway 7.

The price is right, averaging about 20 cents per copy for a book that Pierre Berton may have thrown out. Attics have been cleared and current book shelves emptied to supply the thousands of

books on the tables. New best sellers, some with slightly damaged jackets, have been included along with the "collectibles" published before the turn of the century.

Old school primers, new textbooks and new science fiction and mysteries join books like "The Pin-Up" illustrated with the famous colored nude calendar picture of Marilyn Monroe.

Some of these make fascinating reading for a student of the changing times and the status of women.

A book like "Repented at Leisure" outlines in purple prose the trials of a 17-year-old ravishing beauty who marries a man she hardly knows, only to have him popped into jail for felony at the end of the marriage service.

Poor Ethel keeps her dreadful secret for ten

long years, spurning all suitors, and hating her husband, until the day the released prisoner turns up as gameskeeper. The plot thickens.

A book called "The Gayworthys" is written by a Mrs. Whitney (no first name mentioned) — "a story of threads and thorns"; and books with titles like "The Fortune Hunter", "The Brute" and "The Bondsman" hint of sociological problems in the flaming twenties.

A quick look at a book called "A Peep Behind the Scenes" shows that almost every chapter starts with the same words, "The next morning, as Rosalie awoke", etc.

Then, of course, there are copies of the famous Elsie Dinsmore books

including "Elsie's Widowhood", all liberally sprinkled with moral lessons and religious teachings.

Indeed, the religious tract societies seem to have been among the most prolific publishers of their day — around the turn of the century.

"Willie the Waif" is another of their gems. "Just David" by Eleanor H. Porter, author of Pollyanna, will bring back memories to today's grandmothers, along with "Very Good, Jeeves", by P.G. Wodehouse. Copies of "The Garden of Allah" and "The Sheikh" suggest delights of the Arab world beyond the confine of Victorian life.

There is a special 1885 edition of "The Swiss Family Robinson" also illustrated, it's pages and

cover yellowing with age. Old handsome editions of best loved fairy tales will be a real find for some collectors, along with hundreds of recycled Harlequin romances, mystery stories and Gothic novels.

The book sale will help to finance the services offered by H.E.L.P., an information and referral centre in Woodbridge, serving the Town of Vaughan.

Included in H.E.L.P. volunteer programs are "Meals on Wheels", Mother's Break programs for both English-speaking and Italian-speaking mothers, legal advice, credit counselling and tax form assistance. Emergency services like driving and baby sitting are also supplied.
