The scene — Outside Harrod's Store in London, England near Fleet Street; the home of London's famous newspapers. (Harrod's is comparable to Eaton's Toronto).

A young newspaper editor was walking to work when he saw a crowd across the street in front of one of Harrod's

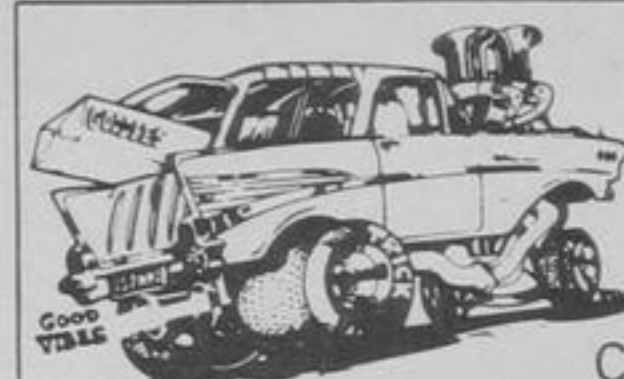
season. Being a newspaper man, he thought there might be a story in that crowd, so he crossed the road.

The crowd was dense but he wormed his way through and stood before the only attraction in the centre of draped curtains.

Upon an easel stood the framed painting known as Titan's Jesus, the head of our Saviour of the crucifixion crowned with the crown of thorns.

After a few moments the young editor noticed a boy by his side with his nose pressed on the pane gazing intensely at the painting.

He would be called then "A street Arab or a waif", possibly an orphan living, with others, in an old railway carriage or under a bridge crossing the river Thames, selling newspapers to gain a few pence for food.

**Biafra, Quebec  
are compared**

THORNHILL — Parallels have been drawn between the problems faced by Biafra during the Biafran conflict and current Canadian worries about the effect of a Quebec separation.

The remarks were made last week by Dr. Russel Hall, resource director of the Canadian Bible Society, as part of an address to the annual meeting of the Richmond Hill-Thornhill ministerial associations.

Dr. Hall spoke with affection of his 10 years as missionary in Nigeria, where he was moderator of the Presbyterian Church from January 1973 until July 1974.

Dr. Hall, who was in Lagos during the civil war, told association members there is still a great need for teachers and medical people in Nigeria.

He said he hoped many young Canadians would choose to work there.

a single parent**

RICHMOND HILL — The following prayer appeared in a newsletter published this month by the Richmond Hill Thornhill Chapter of the One Parent Families Association of Canada:

"I write this to you, God, with the hope you will understand.

I feel lost, separated, totally alone. And yet, there are many close by. I wonder where I can find the happiness and peace of mind I need so desperately. I want the closeness and total caring of another human being; the ones for whom I care are incapable of caring for anyone but themselves.

Teach me that to be alone is not the worst thing in the world.

I have become regretful of the past, frightful of the future and dissatisfied with the present. Help me fill this void by erasing my desire for revenge and replace it with a forgiving spirit. For I have surely hurt others, and need forgiveness also. Amen."

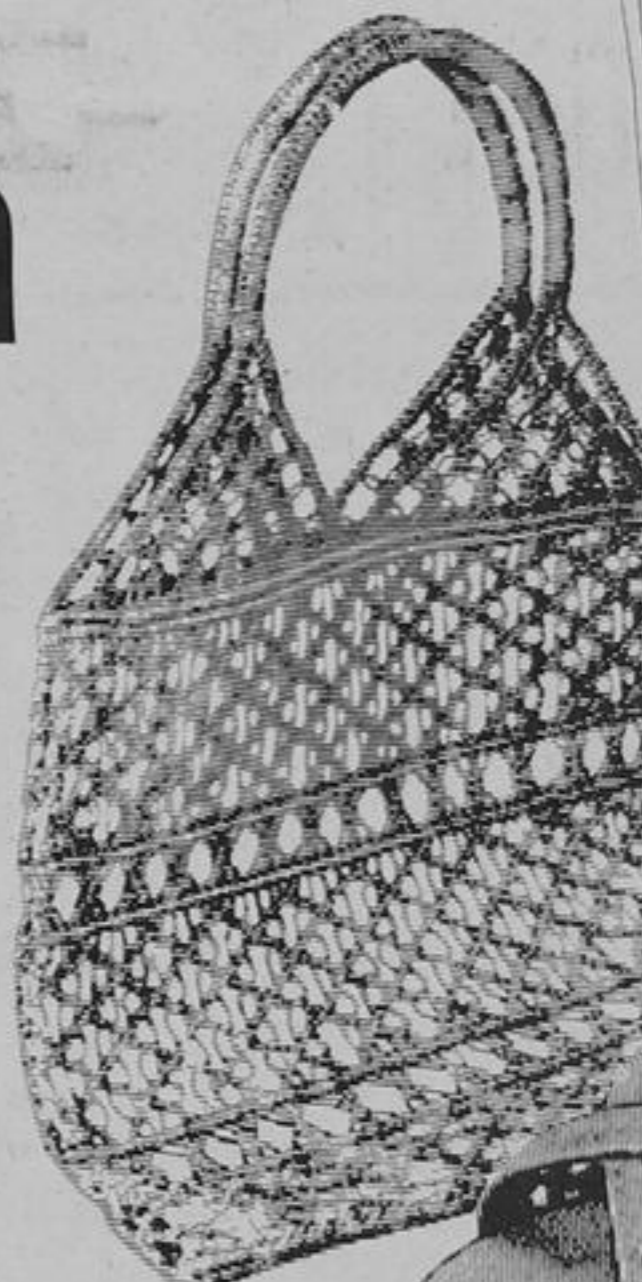

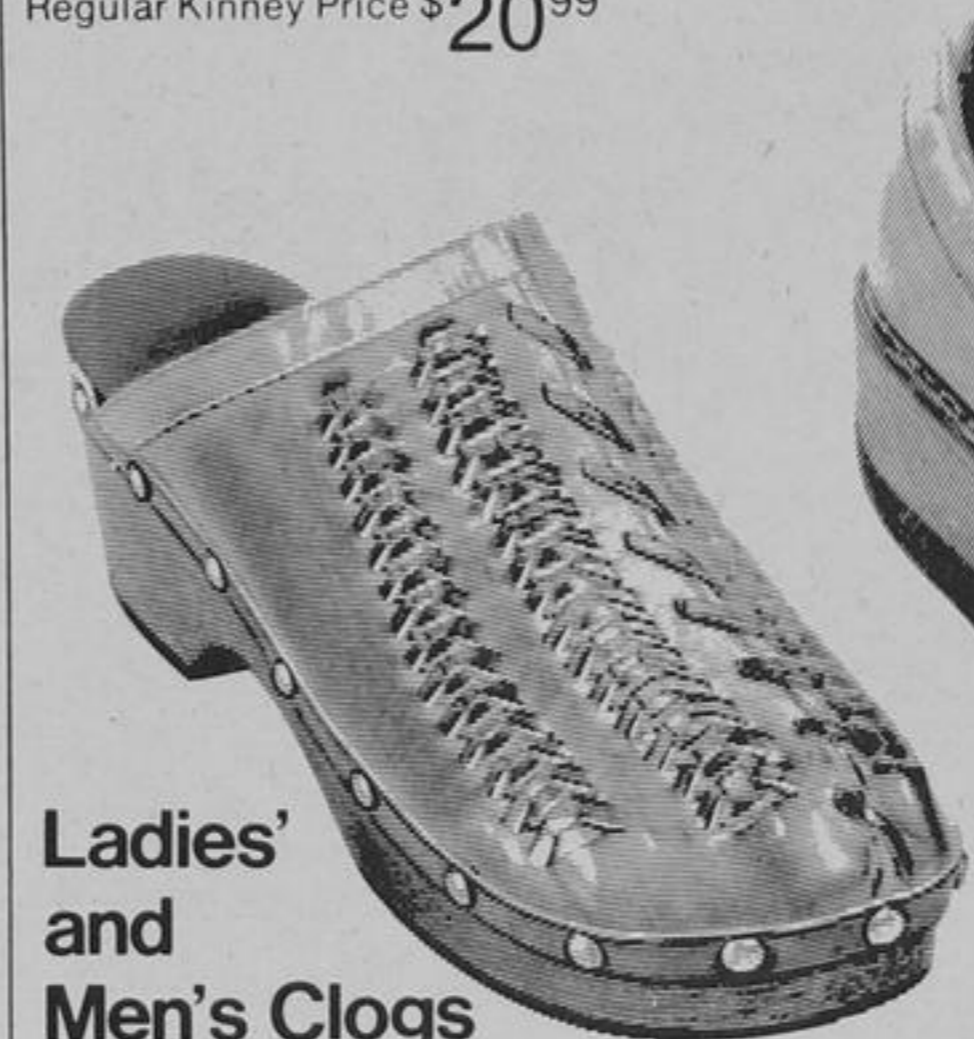
