## Hold put on tanks

Holding tanks — an alternative to either septic systems or municipal sewage services — will be increasingly difficult to obtain, due to a regional council decision taken last week.

The new policy on holding tanks was drawn up because of increasing demand in newly developed areas.

It allows the regional treatment facility to accept only those wastes which originate where tanks have been installed as a solution to sewage disposal or health problems.

Any exceptions must be approved by the regional council and engineering committee.

The time such wastes may be taken to regional facilities shall be established by the commissioner of engineering.

There will be a \$5-1,000 gallon fee . . . to be adjusted annually.

Newmarket Councillor Bob Forhan said "some places are held up by construction."

"Holding tanks would be removed within a year."

Forhan complained the suggested policy lacked flexibility.

"Industrial parks would not be allowed to go in without sewage," he said.

Dr. Slingerland of the health department said he heard reports of raw sewage being dumped on fields. He urged tighter municipal controls.

"The dumping fee suggested," said Richmond Hill Mayor David Schiller, "is 10 times the cost of processing."

"I'm wondering how the \$5-1,000 gallon figure came about."

### Mental health grant

York Central Hospital in Richmond Hill has received a grant of \$70,130 to operate a community day care mental health program.

The grant was announced by Health Minister Dennis Timbrell, and covers operating costs for the current fiscal year, plus an extra \$69,330 for the fiscal year starting April 1, 1978.

Timbrell said that new approaches to the treatment of the mentally ill included the therapeutic benefit of maintaining people in their own community.

The program will employ group, individual, occupational and family therapy, as well as psychodrama, vocational counselling and community rehabilitation.
