

New office plan

The long needed expansion of the York Region Roman Catholic separate school board administrative offices may finally be in sight.

Board members voted to go ahead with preliminary plans for a new centre, though Education Director John Zupancic stressed the board still wants to consider other alternatives.

When the board was formed in 1969, the offices were located in an unused 3-room school on Dufferin Street.

Since then two portables have been added. The consultant staff now work out of two spare classrooms at Our Lady Help of Christians school in Richmond Hill.

The total area is approximately 6,400 square feet.

"The needs over the next 10 years are going to be just tremendous," said Director Zupancic.

"We need more space. We need to pull our people together."

According to the ministry of education, separate school enrolment in the region will increase by 18 per cent over the next 10 years.

There are currently 7,845 separate school students in York Region.

Trustees Leo Wigglesworth and Con Thompson have been investigating the need for expansion.

They pushed last week for construction approval for a proposed 15,000 sq. ft. administration centre to be located beside the present offices at an estimated cost of \$600,000.

Frank Bobesich, superintendent of program, feels it would be better to tear down the three-room structure — formerly Our Lady of Fatima school — than to adapt it to another use.

Trustee Frank Kelly, though conceding the need, said he couldn't approve construction before seeing plans, cost estimates, and funding alternatives.

"We may have to rent office space somewhere," said Zupancic.

The board voted 13-2 to proceed with plans. Thompson and Wigglesworth objected, arguing construction ought to be approved as well.
