

# 3 teachers on honor list

York County board of education nominated three people for the Fred L. Bartlett Memorial Award, presented annually by Ontario Public School Teachers' Association.

The award honors an active or retired member of the teaching profession who has made a valuable contribution to education. Nominated were: Mrs. Mary Scott, a special education consultant with the board since its inception; Donald Campbell Attridge, head of the mathematics department at Thornlea secondary school; Jean Marion Swanson, who retired last December after having served as a master teacher of language arts here since 1969.

Mrs. Scott also taught in several schools in Vaughan and King. She was remedial consultant

for the board of TSA King from its inception in 1968. She received her BA degree from York university in 1971 after 26 years of extramural work. More recently, she became involved with the education for exceptional students program at York, and in 1976 was named adjunct professor of the program.

Mr. Attridge, who also taught at Thornhill and Bayview secondary schools, received his BA from Western university in 1956, and his MA in math from York in 1970.

He is the co-author of Mathematics: A Resource Book, and Starting Points in Mathematics: 9, with another volume under way.

He is also one of the four founders of the junior mathematics contest across Canada, in which a team from Thornlea tied

for first place this year. A total of 20,500 students participated.

## Lt. gov. makes King City visit

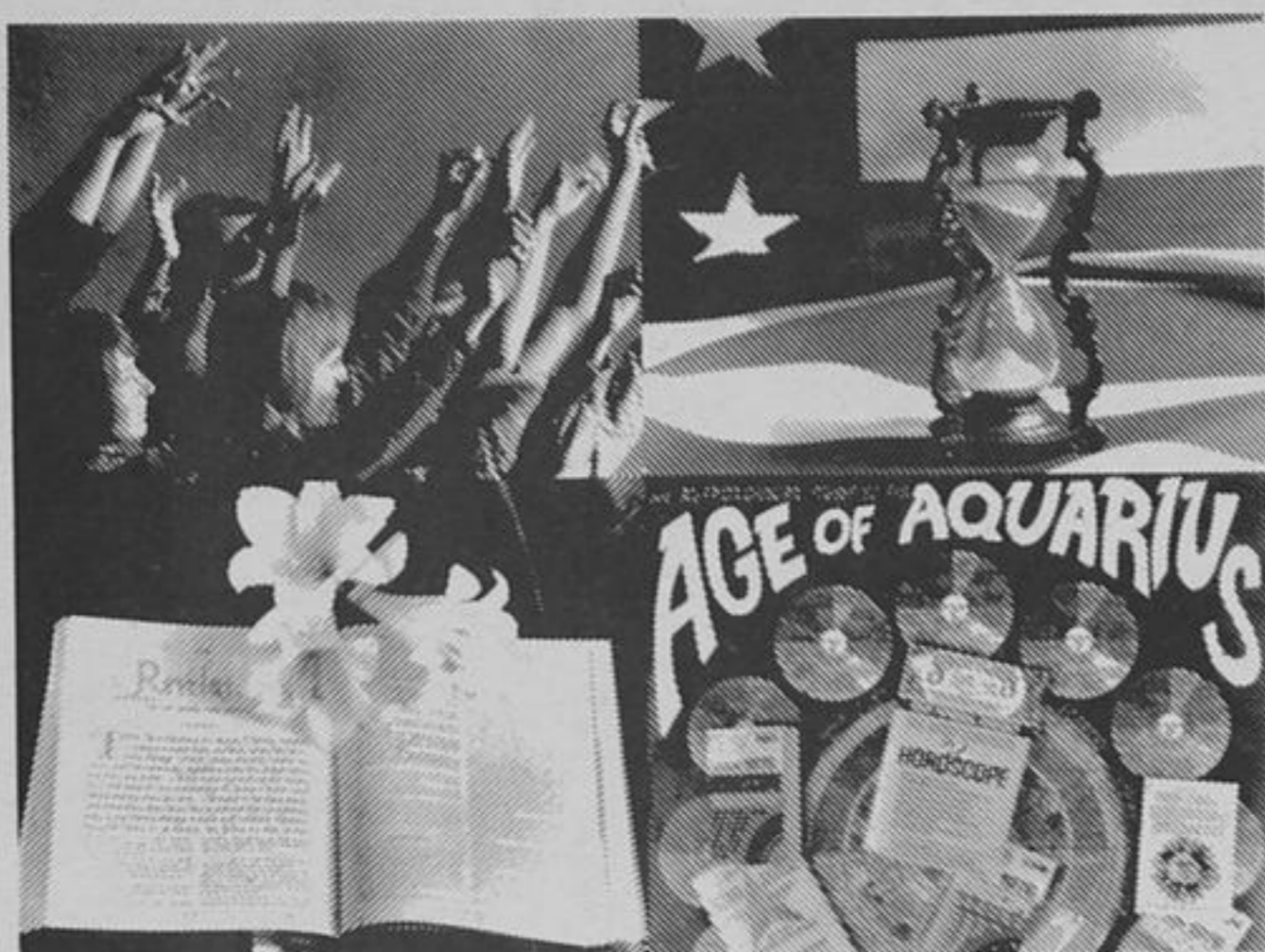

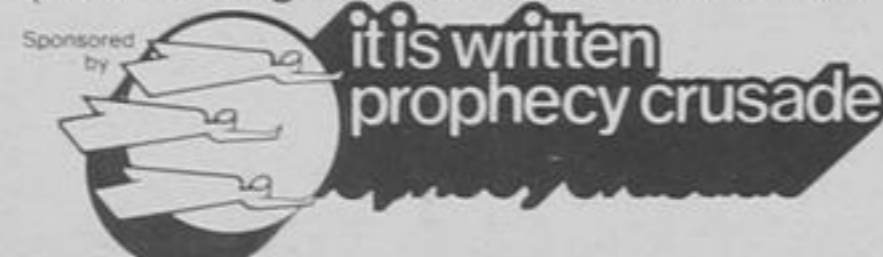
