## To develop Oak Ridges

The 10-acre Oak Ridges property will be one of 15 conservation areas slated for extensive development by the Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority, Natural Resources Minister Frank Miller announced.

The 5-year program will provide a comprehensive system of

conservation management, including stream improvement, fish and woodlot management, reforestation and creation of outdoor recreation opportunities.

For this year, \$3,000 will be spent in Oak Ridges for tree and wildlife planting. As well, \$400 will go towards general development of

the property. The total estimated cost of the 5-year program is \$209,492.

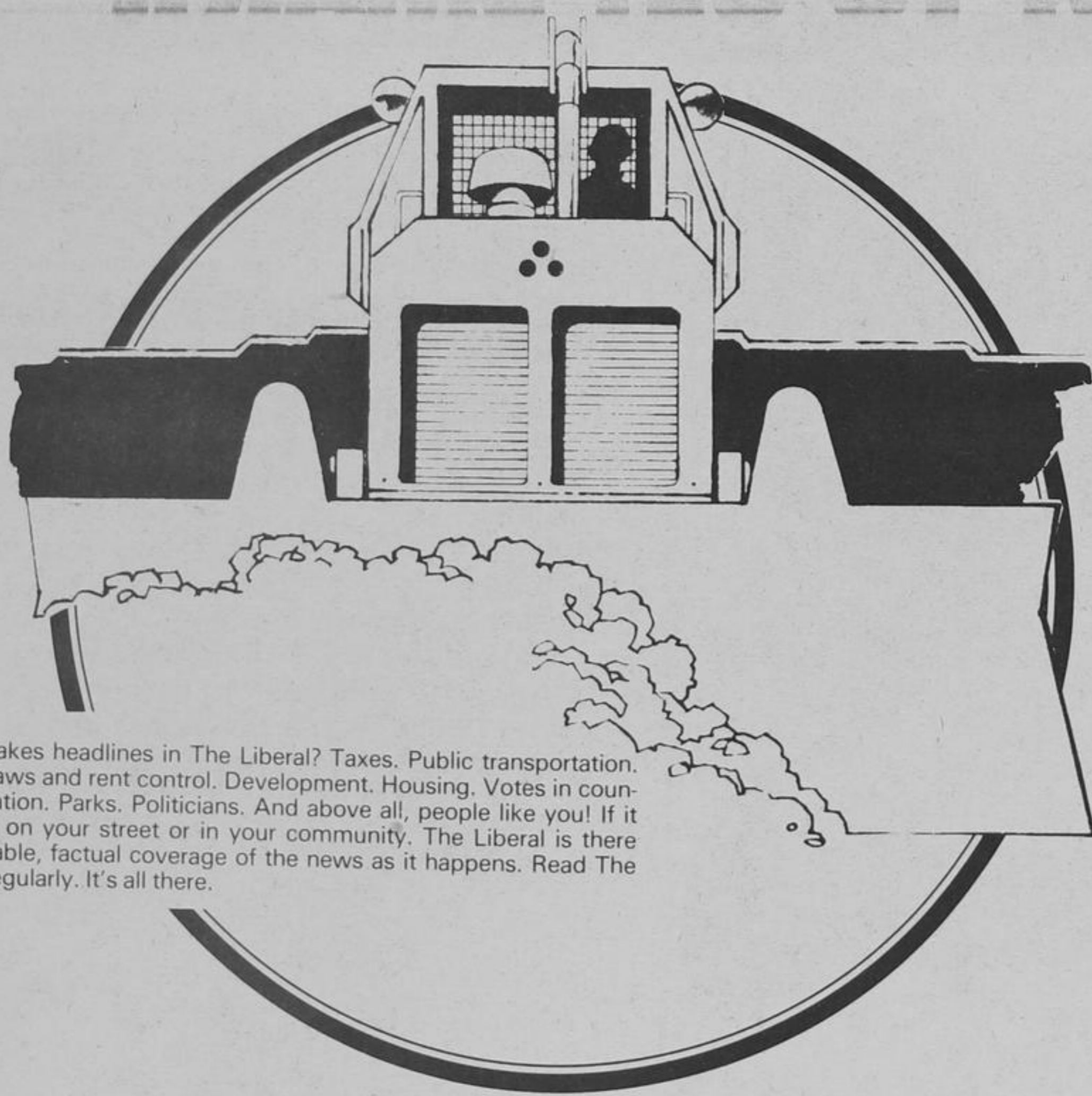

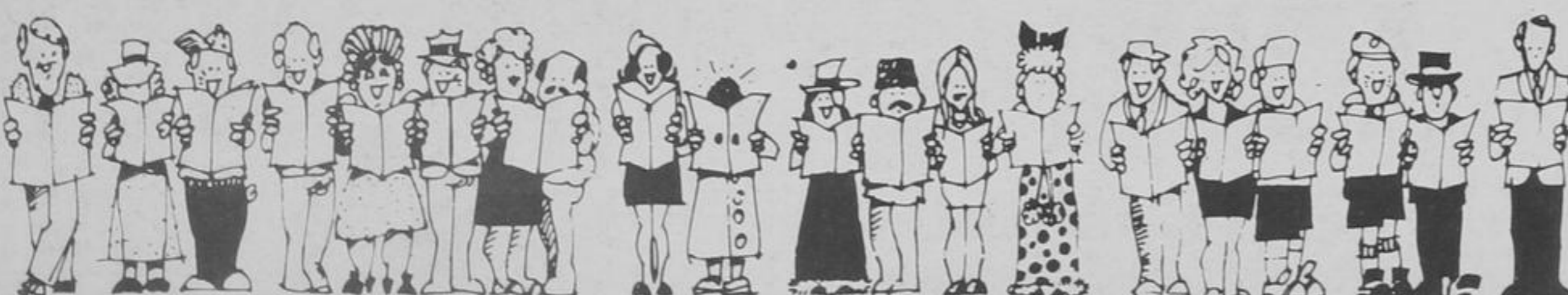
