Police are seeking a man, who allegedly threatened a veterinarian for trying to collect a fee.

However, he since was visited by the boyfriend of his client, who threatened him with bodily harm, he told police.

Brian Berger, Yardley Ave., told police his wallet had been taken from his coat, which was on a rack at the centre.

A total of \$2,200 in tools was taken the first time, while an undisclosed amount of cash, tools and office equipment was taken on the next visit.

Richmond Hill Chrysler, Yonge St., reported \$1,660 damage to its building, \$300 damage to a car, which was stolen and then recovered, plus the theft of \$92 in cash in a break-in last week.

At Hillcrest Mall, clerks at both Pot Pourri and Le Chateau, were robbed of sums of cash.

Police said the first clerk lost a wallet containing \$35, while the other one was relieved of \$118 in cash receipts.

Second Hill robbery

York Regional Police reported the second armed robbery in Richmond Hill in the past three weeks.

Peter Delisle, manager of Emerald Isle Motel, 8700 Yonge St., told police a man entered the motel about 4:55 a.m., May 9, and chatted to him briefly. He then pulled a gun and demanded money.

After receiving \$500, the man left the building and ran south on Yonge St.

He was described as being in his late 20s, five feet, seven, 145-155 pounds, clean shaven,

short, brown hair, full sideburns, wearing glasses with light, brown plastic frames, blue denim jacket, blue shirt, with blue, horizontal stripes, brown work pants and black shoes or boots.

On April 22, two club-wielding bandits made off with nearly \$5,000 from Warehouse Foods, Yonge St.

Police are seeking an 18-year-old man in connection with an incident at Mr. Submarine, 10447 Yonge St., Richmond Hill, May 14, about 6:20 p.m.

According to police, three people came into the restaurant and

started to make a noise. When they were asked to leave, one of them struck an employee and then ripped the telephone off the wall.

They then took off.

Thornhill, too
Thornhill Community Centre was the site of a similar event, only this time there were three assaults.

According to police, two men who had been roller skating at the centre, were told to leave at closing time, but refused to do so.

Instead they attacked the three attendants, sending one of them to hospital for treatment of his eye.

Facing charges of common assault are James Lennox, 18, and William Cromb, 18, both of Oak Ave., Richmond Hill.

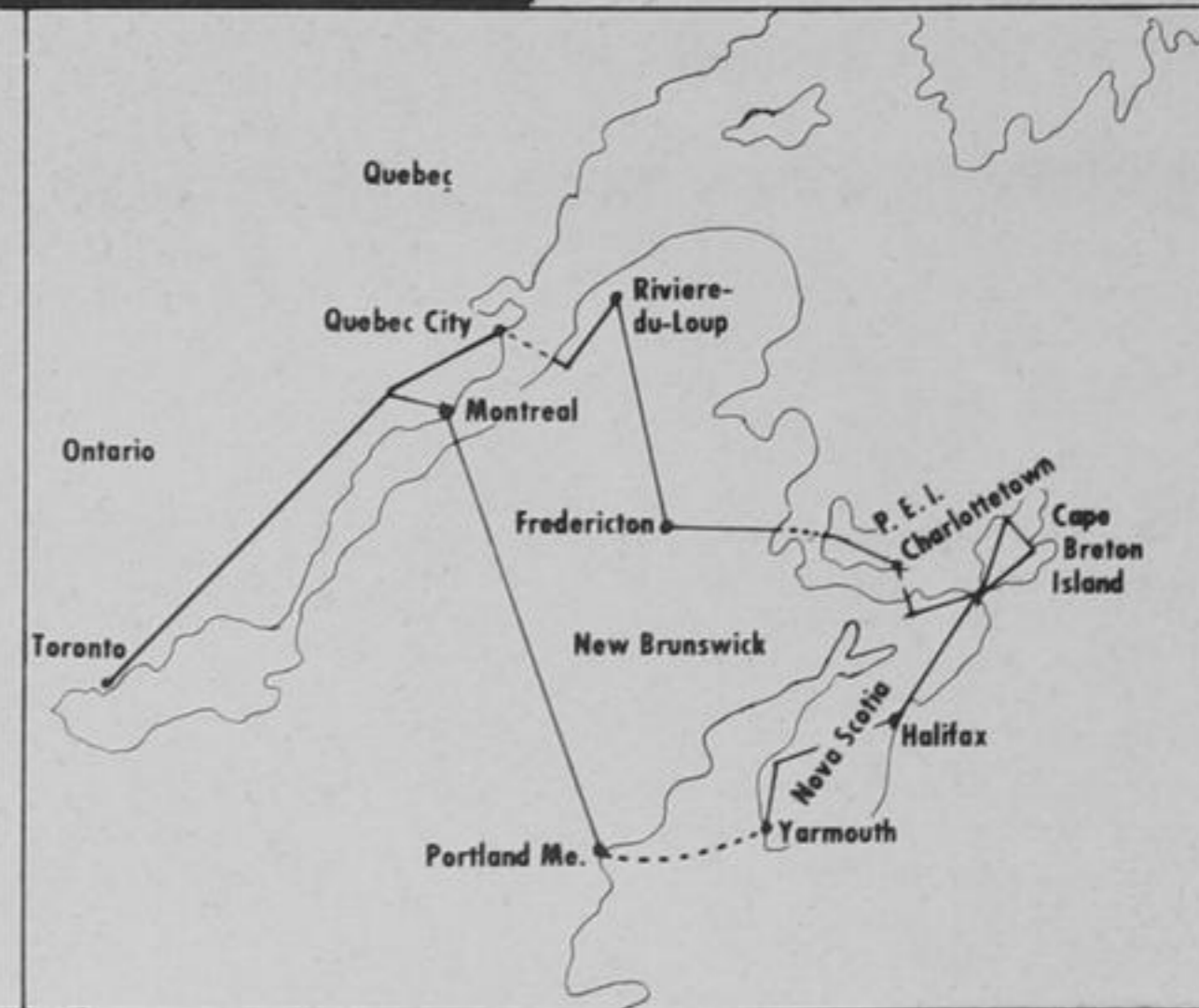
