

# Hill youth Ontario tramp champ!



## Superman yet?

He's not Superman but he's doing all right. Scott Cleland of the Richmond Hill Trampoline Club shows the style that won

him two gold medals and a silver in the provincial championships last weekend at Kingston. Scott's brother, Rick Cleland, did

all right too. He won the senior advanced competition for best male trampolinist in Ontario.

Richmond Hill Trampoline Club Coach Frank Juhasz was literally bouncing with joy after last weekend's provincial championships in Kingston. For a good reason.

When the championships were over he had Ontario's best male trampolinist on his side.

That was Rick Cleland who won the senior advanced competition and the Ontario Gymnastic Federation Provincial trophy which goes with it. "I have to say I was surprised," admits coach Juhasz. "According to ratings there were two others who should have finished ahead of Rick."

Someone forgot to mention this to Rick.

"He came up with some terrific routines. It was just his day. It was definitely one of his best efforts." But that wasn't all for coach Juhasz. He had other big winners. Like Scott Cleland. That's right, Rick's brother.

Scott was the best individual winner for Richmond Hill as he came up with two gold medals and a silver for his weekend effort.

Says Juhasz: "Another surprise." Scott finished a close second — missing by .7 points from being a winner — in the Junior Boys (14 and

under) to walk off with a silver medal. Winner was Neil Hooper of Kingston. He then combined with the same Hooper to finish first in the synchronization routines; and first in the mixed synchronization with Heather Ferguson. These latter two resulted in gold medals.

There's still more gold to come. Richmond Hill's Liz Peterson picked up her second gold medal in as many years as she again won the Novice competition for girls.

Liz has been with the Richmond Hill club for four years and is a student at Langstaff Secondary School.

Then it was teammate Robin Weekes discovering gold in the Senior Novice for women. It was her second win in a row in this event. Robin has been with the club for two years.

Also impressing was the coach's son, Gary Juhasz, who hung in there for a third place finish in the Junior Boys (16 and under) and came up with a bronze medal.

Gary moved up from beginners to juniors last year and has twice captured the bronze medal. He only practiced six weeks for this competition as he had played hockey for the Richmond Hill Roman Bantams. He's a goalie.
